Re: Notice of Potential Liability Status

Dear Mr. Hamilton:

Ten months have elapsed since The Beazer Group received notice that Ecology proposed to find it a "potentially liable person" under Section 4 of the Model Toxics Control Act for the operations at the Old Machine Shop, Weyerhaeuser Mill E, located at 101 East Marine View Drive, Everett, Washington. Despite the objection to Ecology's proposed findings, new information has been brought to Ecology's attention that would substantiate Ecology's proposed finding.

Washington Department of Revenue files contain information on the relationship of The Beazer Group to Koppers Company Inc. Koppers Company has been found on a 1963 revised version of a 1957 Sanborn fire insurance map. The Sanborn map shows the Koppers Company situated on the southern portion of the Weyerhaeuser Mill "B" property.

Based on the findings, notice is hereby given to The Beazer Group that Ecology finds The Beazer Group to be a "potentially liable person" under Section 4 of the Model Toxic Control Act, as applied to the "facility" known as Old Machine Shop, Weyerhaeuser Mill E located at 101 East Marine View Drive, Everett, Washington.
