IN THE MATTER OF GRANTING A WATER QUALITY CERTIFICATION TO Skokomish Indian Tribe pursuant to 33 U.S.C. 1341 (FWPCA \$401), RCW 90.48.120, RCW 90.48.260 and Chapter 173-201A WAC ORDER No. 19696 Corps Reference No. 202001012 Skokomish Dabob Lease located on tidelands within Dabob Bay, Hood Canal, near Quilcene, Jefferson County, Washington

On January 20, 2021, the Skokomish Indian Tribe submitted a request for a Section 401 Water Quality Certification (WQC) under the federal Clean Water Act for the Skokomish Dabob Lease, Jefferson County, Washington. The Department of Ecology (Ecology) issued a public notice on March 5, 2021.

This project proposes to lease this 50.3 acre property to protect and enhance cultural and subsistence resources as well as pursue commercial shellfish aquaculture. Plans include 6.4 acres on-bottom oyster culture, 1.3 acre bottom-attached bag culture for single oysters together on the same 1.3 acre Pacific oyster spat collecting bags, 3.3 acres Manila clam culture (netting) and gravelling to enhance the clam habitat, and a portion of the 6.4 acres for Olympia oyster restoration and enhancement. The Tribe also plans to use 1.3 acre of the parcel for wild oyster (Pacific oyster) catch seasonally to support enhancement of oysters on other beaches of Hood Canal.

The project site is located on tidelands within Dabob Bay, Hood Canal, on parcel number 701271001, near Quilcene, Jefferson County, Washington; Section 27, Township 27 North, Range 1 West; WRIA 17, Quilcene-Snow Watershed.

With this Order, Ecology is granting the Skokomish Indian Tribe request for a Section 401 Water Quality Certification for the Skokomish Dabob Lease project, provided that the activity is conducted in accordance with the Section 401 Water Quality Certification request and attachments Ecology received on January 20, 2021, and the following supporting documentation:

1. E-mail letter to Ecology dated February 19, 2021, regarding the project's water quality monitoring plan, and the Tribes commitment to follow the 2019 Puget Sound Shellfish Growers Association Environmental Codes of Practice for Shellfish Aquaculture at the Skokomish Dabob Lease project.

Based on the information submitted, Ecology has determined that the discharge from the project will comply with state water quality requirements. Prior to undertaking any changes that materially alter the project, the Skokomish Indian Tribe must contact Ecology to determine whether a new Section 401 Water Quality Certification is required.

Issuance of this Section 401 Water Quality Certification for this proposal does not authorize the Skokomish Indian Tribe to exceed applicable state water quality standards (Chapter 173-201A WAC), ground water quality standards (Chapter 173-200 WAC) or sediment quality standards (Chapter 173-204 WAC). Furthermore, nothing in this Section 401 Water Quality Certification absolves the Applicant from liability for contamination and any subsequent cleanup of surface waters, ground waters, or sediments resulting from project construction or operations.

Any work that causes distressed or dying fish or discharges of oil, fuel, or other chemicals into state waters or onto land with a potential for entry into state waters is prohibited. If such work, conditions, or discharges occur, immediately notify² Ecology's Regional Spill Response Office at 360-407-6300 and the Washington State Department of Fish & Wildlife with the nature and details of the problem, any actions taken to correct the problem, and any proposed changes in operation to prevent further problems. You will also need to notify the Washington Emergency Management Division³ at 1-800-258-5990, for actual spills to water only. This condition is necessary to prevent oil and hazardous materials spills from causing environmental damage and to ensure compliance with water quality requirements. The sooner a spill is reported, the quicker it can be addressed, resulting in less harm.

In view of the foregoing and in accordance with 33 U.S.C. §1341, RCW 90.48.120, RCW 90.48.260 Chapter 173-200 WAC and Chapter 173-201A WAC, this WQC is granted to the Skokomish Indian Tribe, Skokomish Dabob Lease project.

This Certification is not effective until the U.S. Corps of Engineers (Corps) Seattle District issues an individual Department of the Army (DA) permit for this project. Order No. **19696** will remain in effect for the duration of the associated DA permit. The Skokomish Indian Tribe should send a copy of the final DA permit to fednotification@ecy.wa.gov within two weeks of receiving it.

YOUR RIGHT TO APPEAL

You have a right to appeal this Order to the Pollution Control Hearing Board (PCHB) within 30 days of the date of receipt of this Order. The appeal process is governed by Chapter 43.21B RCW and Chapter 371-08 WAC. "Date of receipt" is defined in RCW 43.21B.001(2).

To appeal you must do both of the following within 30 days of the date of receipt of this Order:

- File your appeal and a copy of this Order with the PCHB (see addresses below). Filing means actual receipt by the PCHB during regular business hours.
- Serve a copy of your appeal and this Order on Ecology in paper form by mail or in person. (See addresses below.) E-mail is not accepted.
