This is an Administrative Order requiring Habitat for Humanity Seattle to comply with Chapter 90.48 RCW and the rules and regulations of the Department of Ecology (Ecology) by taking certain actions which are described below. RCW 90.48.120(1) authorizes Ecology to issue Administrative Orders requiring compliance whenever it determines that a person has violated or creates a substantial potential to violate any provision of Chapter 90.48 RCW.

On January 19, 2021, Ecology received a request to impact 893 ft² of non-federally regulated wetland to construct the Burien Demonstration Cottages in Burien. This project consists of 40 townhome units, a community center, outdoor playground, access road, and 43 parking stalls. The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (Corps) issued its jurisdictional determination on March 31, 2021. The site is located at 511- and 515- South 136th Street, Section 17, Township 23N, Range 4E, King County, in WRIA 9.

This Administrative Order authorizes 893 ft² of Category III wetland impacts at the project location. Offsite mitigation for this proposal will consist of purchasing 1.44 credits at King County Mitigation Reserves Program.

For purposes of this Order, the term "Applicant" shall mean Habitat for Humanity Seattle and its agents, assigns, and contractors.

In view of the foregoing and in accordance with RCW 90.48.120(1):

IT IS ORDERED that the Applicant shall comply with the following:

A. General Conditions:

- A.1 The Applicant shall construct and operate the project in a manner consistent with the project description contained in the JARPA received by Ecology on January 19, 2021 or as otherwise approved by Ecology.
- A.2 For purposes of this Order, all submittals required by its conditions shall be sent to Ecology's Northwest Regional Office, Attn: Doug Gresham, SEA Program, PO Box

- 330316, Shoreline, WA 98133 or via e-mail to <u>fednotification@ecy.wa.gov</u> and a cc to doug.gresham@ecy.wa.gov. Any submittals shall reference Order No. 19904
- A.3 The Applicant shall provide access to the project site upon request by Ecology.
- A.4 Copies of this Order shall be kept on the job site and readily available for reference by Ecology personnel, the construction superintendent, construction managers and foremen, and state and local government inspectors.
- A.5 Nothing in this Order waives Ecology's authority to issue additional orders if Ecology determines further actions are necessary to implement the water quality laws of the state. Further, Ecology retains continuing jurisdiction to make modifications hereto through supplemental order, if additional impacts due to project construction or operation are identified (e.g., violations of water quality standards, downstream erosion, etc.), or if additional conditions are necessary to further protect the public interest.
- A.6 The Applicant shall ensure that all appropriate project engineers and contractors at the project site have read and understand relevant conditions of this Order and all permits, approvals, and documents referenced in this Order.

B. Notification Requirements:

- B.1 The Applicant shall provide written notification (e-mail or mail) to Doug Gresham in Ecology's Northwest Regional Office, in accordance with condition A.2 above for the following activities:
 - a. At least ten (10) days prior to the onset of any work on site
 - b. At least seven (7) days within the start of impacts to wetlands.
 - c. Immediately following a violation of the state water quality standards or any condition of this Order
 - d. Within fourteen (14) days after completion of construction.

C. Wetland Compensatory Mitigation Conditions:

- C.1 The Applicant shall mitigate wetland impacts as described in the In-Lieu Fee Plan-Burien Habitat for Humanity (hereafter called the "in-lieu fee plan") prepared by the Watershed Company, Inc., dated January 8, 2021 or as revised and approved by Ecology.
- C.2 Prior to impacting wetlands, the Applicant shall submit to Ecology documentation from the bank sponsor verifying the purchase of 1.44 credits (credits) from the King County Mitigation Reserves Program. This documentation must include the permit number, permit issuance date, impact acreage, the amount of credits required by the permit, and date of credit purchase.
- C.3 The Applicant shall notify and submit in writing to Ecology (see A.2) any proposed changes to the amount of wetland impacts, revision to the bank use plan, and/or submittal of new information for review and approval before work begins.

- C.4 The Applicant shall complete the purchase of credits before the impacts to wetlands occur, or Ecology may require additional compensation to account for additional temporal loss.
- C.5 If the Applicant has not purchased credits or completed the Burien Demonstration Cottages within 13 months of the date of this Order, the Applicant shall inform Ecology, in writing, of the status of
 - a) Burien Demonstration Cottages
 - b) When credits will be purchased

With the:

- c) Reason for the delay
- d) Expected date of completion

The Applicant shall submit an updated written notification every 12 months thereafter until Burien Demonstration Cottages is complete and the required credits are purchased.

D. Timing:

D.1 This Order shall remain in effect for a period of two years from the date of issuance unless otherwise modified by Ecology. Failure to comply with this Order may result in the issuance of civil penalties or other actions, whether administrative or judicial, to enforce the terms of this Order.

YOUR RIGHT TO APPEAL

You have a right to appeal this Order to the Pollution Control Hearing Board (PCHB) within 30 days of the date of receipt of this Order. The appeal process is governed by Chapter 43.21B RCW and Chapter 371-08 WAC. "Date of receipt" is defined in RCW 43.21B.001(2).

To appeal you must do both of the following within 30 days of the date of receipt of this Order:

- File your appeal and a copy of this Order with the PCHB (see addresses below). Filing means actual receipt by the PCHB during regular business hours.
- Serve a copy of your appeal and this Order on Ecology in paper form by mail or in person. (See addresses below.) E-mail is not accepted.

You must also comply with other applicable requirements in Chapter 43.21B RCW and Chapter 371-08 WAC.
