On September 29, 2021, Station House Oyster Company submitted a request for a Section 401 Water Quality Certification (WQC) under the federal Clean Water Act for Station House Oyster Company Project 7, Pacific County, Washington. The Department of Ecology (Ecology) issued a public notice for the project on October 8, 2021.

This project proposes to continue to cultivate Manila clam (*Venerupis philippinarum*) on 4 acres of private intertidal land, between +2.0ft and +2.5ft Mean Lower Low Water (MLLW) tidal elevation. Both native and non-native eelgrass are present within the project site.

Hatchery-grown clams are seeded by hand directly onto the beach substrate. Natural spawning and setting of clams will also occur.

Prior to planting, clam beds are prepared by applying a thin layer of washed gravel mixed with shell fragments directly to the substrate (also called "frosting"). Typically, only a portion of the bed is frosted at a time. This activity occurs every 2 years or so, when the tide is high enough to float a barge carrying the frosting material. Material will be distributed evenly across the bed from a barge or skiff to a depth of less than 0.5 inches when the tide is high enough to float a barge. Several thin layers of material may be placed over a period of days. To place a single 0.5-inch layer requires about 70 cubic yards of washed gravel or shell per acre. An individual site (or portion of the clam bed) would not be frosted more frequently than once every 2 years.

Clams are hand-harvested every 2-3 years during low tide, using a clam rake, shovel or other hand-operated tool. Market-size clams are selectively harvested, placed in buckets, bagged, tagged, and removed. Undersized clams are returned to beds for future harvests. Since a given clam bed may contain multiple year classes of clams, it may be harvested on a regular schedule to harvest individual year classes of clams.

The project site is located on tidelands within Willapa Bay, on parcel number 11111555592 (TL 111115592), near Long Beach, Pacific County, Washington; Section 15, Township 11 North, Range 11 West; WRIA 24, Willapa Watershed.

With this Order, Ecology is granting Station House Oyster Company's request for a Section 401 Water Quality Certification for the Station House Oyster Company Project 7 project, provided that the activity is conducted in accordance with the Section 401 Water Quality Certification request and attachments Ecology received on September 29, 2021.

Based on the information submitted, Ecology has determined that the discharge from the project will comply with state water quality requirements. Prior to undertaking any changes that materially alter the project, Station House Oyster Company must contact Ecology to determine whether a new Section 401 Water Quality Certification is required.

Issuance of this Section 401 Water Quality Certification for this proposal does not authorize Station House Oyster Company to exceed applicable state water quality standards (Chapter 173-201A WAC), ground water quality standards (Chapter 173-200 WAC) or sediment quality standards (Chapter 173-204 WAC). Furthermore, nothing in this Section 401 Water Quality Certification absolves the Applicant from liability for contamination and any subsequent cleanup of surface waters, ground waters, or sediments resulting from project construction or operations.

Special Condition:

Any work that causes distressed or dying fish or discharges of oil, fuel, or other chemicals into state waters or onto land with a potential for entry into state waters is prohibited. If such work, conditions, or discharges occur, immediately notify Ecology's Regional Spill Response Office at 360-407-6300 and the Washington State Department of Fish & Wildlife with the nature and details of the problem, any actions taken to correct the problem, and any proposed changes in operation to prevent further problems. You will also need to notify the Washington Emergency Management Division at 1-800-258-5990, for actual spills to water only. This condition is necessary to prevent oil and hazardous materials spills from causing environmental damage and to ensure compliance with water quality requirements. The sooner a spill is reported, the quicker it can be addressed, resulting in less harm.

In view of the foregoing and in accordance with 33 U.S.C. §1341, RCW 90.48.120, RCW 90.48.260 Chapter 173-200 WAC and Chapter 173-201A WAC, this WQC is granted to the Station House Oyster Company, Station House Oyster Company Project 7 project.
