On February 1, 2022, the City of Lynnwood Parks, Recreation & Cultural Arts Department submitted a request for a Section 401 Water Quality Certification (WQC) under the federal Clean Water Act for the Scriber Creek Trail Improvements Phase 2 project, Snohomish County, Washington. The following processing dates are referenced below:

- On January 26, 2022, the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (Corps) notified Ecology that they would be reviewing the project for authorization under Nationwide Permit #42, and an individual Section 401 is required.
- On February 22, 2022, Ecology issued a public notice for the project.

This project proposes to make critical upgrades to an existing shared-use path from the Lynnwood Transit Center to Wilcox Park. The project will increase the width of the trail to 10-12 feet with 2-foot shoulders, elevate the trail along boardwalk to alleviate trail flooding, and realign the trail to allow for a wider turn radius. When crossing Scriber Creek and the associated wetland complex, boardwalk decking will be constructed using pervious fiberglass grating, which will allow filtered sunlight and precipitation to reach the ground. The project is anticipated to improve public access by providing a non-motorized transportation alternative for accessing the Lynnwood Transit Center and the future light rail station. The trail will cause 7,801 ft² of vegetation conversion in Wetland B, which will be mitigated on-site through 1,789 ft² of reestablishment and 7,801 ft² of restoration.

The project site extends from the intersection of 52nd Place W and 200th Street SW to the Lynnwood Transit Center and the trail crosses Scriber Creek, Snohomish County, Washington, Section 21, Township 27N, Range 4E, within Water Resource Inventory Area (WRIA) 8– Cedar/Sammamish Watershed.

With this Order, Ecology is granting the City of Lynnwood Parks, Recreation & Cultural Arts Department's request for a Section 401 Water Quality Certification for the Scriber Creek Trail Improvements Phase 2 project, provided that the activity is conducted in accordance with the Section 401 Water Quality Certification request and attachments that Ecology received on February 1, 2022, that include the following supporting documentation:

- 1. *Scriber Creek Trail Phase 2: Environmentally Critical Areas Report*, prepared by Parametrix, and dated January 2021.
- 2. *Scriber Creek Trail Phase 2: Mitigation Plan*, prepared by Parametrix, and dated February, 2021.

Based on the information submitted, Ecology has determined that the discharges from the project will comply with state water quality requirements. Prior to undertaking any changes that materially alter the project, the City of Lynnwood Parks, Recreation & Cultural Arts Department must contact Ecology to determine whether a new Section 401 Water Quality Certification is required.

Issuance of this Section 401 Water Quality Certification for this proposal does not authorize the City of Lynnwood Parks, Recreation & Cultural Arts Department to exceed applicable state water quality standards (Chapter 173-201A WAC), ground water quality standards (Chapter 173-200 WAC), or sediment quality standards (Chapter 173-204 WAC). Furthermore, nothing in this Section 401 Water Quality Certification absolves the Applicant from liability for contamination and any subsequent cleanup of surface waters, ground waters, or sediments resulting from project construction or operations.

In view of the foregoing and in accordance with 33 U.S.C. §1341, RCW 90.48.120, RCW 90.48.260 Chapter 173-200 WAC and Chapter 173-201A WAC, this WQC is granted to the City of Lynnwood Parks, Recreation & Cultural Arts Department's for the Scriber Creek Trail Improvements Phase 2 project.

This Certification is not effective until the U.S. Corps of Engineers (Corps) Seattle District issues a Department of the Army (DA) permit for this project. Order No. 21047 will remain valid for the duration of the associated DA permit. Lynnwood Parks, Recreation & Cultural Arts Department should send a copy of the final DA permit to <u>fednotification@ecy.wa.gov</u> within two weeks of receiving it.

YOUR RIGHT TO APPEAL

You have a right to appeal this Order to the Pollution Control Hearings Board (PCHB) within 30 days of the date of receipt of this Order. The appeal process is governed by Chapter 43.21B RCW and Chapter 371-08 WAC. "Date of receipt" is defined in RCW 43.21B.001(2).

To appeal you must do all of the following within 30 days of the date of receipt of this Order:

- File your appeal and a copy of this Order with the PCHB (see addresses below). Filing means actual receipt by the PCHB during regular business hours.
- Serve a copy of your appeal and this Order on Ecology in paper form by mail or in person. (See addresses below.) E-mail is not accepted.

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You must also comply with other applicable requirements in Chapter 43.21B RCW and Chapter 371-08 WAC.
