Dear Michael Schaefer:

On June 7, 2021, the Department of Ecology (Ecology) received a request for a Section 401 Water Quality Certification for the above-referenced project. Ecology has one year from the Section 401 Water Quality Certification request to issue its decision.

At this time, Ecology has not received the necessary information to have reasonable assurance that the project will meet state water quality laws. Therefore, pursuant to Section 401 of the Clean Water Act, Chapter 90.48 RCW, and Chapter 173-201A WAC, Ecology is denying without prejudice BNSF Railway Company's request for a Section 401 Water Quality Certification. Receipt of a denial without prejudice does not preclude you from submitting a new request for a Section 401 Water Quality Certification at a later date.

On June 7, 2021, the Department of Ecology (Ecology) received a request for a Section 401 Water Quality Certification (WQC) via a Joint Aquatic Resources Permit Application (JARPA) for the above-referenced project. Ecology has one year from the receipt of the request for a WQC to issue its decision.

On May 13, 2022, Ecology sent you a letter explaining that we needed the following information:

- Revised project description, plan set, construction methodology, Water Quality Monitoring and Protection Plan, hydraulic analysis for the proposed bridge and temporary structures, and other supporting documents reflecting changes in design and construction approach to address comments received.
- Debris Management Plan for handling of large wood in order to minimize the potential for log jams to pile up at the new bridge as well as during construction activities, causing potential bridge and dike damage, as well as flood risk.
- State Environmental Policy Act determination.

Without the Water Quality Monitoring and Protection Plan and the other plans identified above, Ecology does not have the information needed to demonstrate that the project will meet state water quality laws.¹ Additionally, SEPA² has not been completed, as required by state law. Therefore, <u>pursuant to Section 401 of the Clean Water Act</u>, <u>Chapter 90.48 RCW and Chapter 173-201A WAC</u>, <u>BNSF Railway Company's request for a WQC is denied without prejudice</u>.

Receipt of a denial without prejudice does not preclude you from submitting the information identified above with a new request for a WQC at a later date.

YOUR RIGHT TO APPEAL

You have a right to appeal this Denial Order to the Pollution Control Hearing Board (PCHB) within 30 days of the date of receipt of this Denial Order. The appeal process is governed by Chapter 43.21B RCW and Chapter 371-08 WAC. "Date of receipt" is defined in RCW 43.21B.001(2).

To appeal you must do all of the following within 30 days of the date of receipt of this Order:

- File your appeal and a copy of this Denial Order with the PCHB (see addresses below). Filing means actual receipt by the PCHB during regular business hours.
- Serve a copy of your appeal and this Denial Order on Ecology in paper form by mail or in person. (See addresses below.) E-mail is not accepted.

You must also comply with other applicable requirements in Chapter 43.21B RCW and Chapter 371-08 WAC.
