On February 23, 2022, Underwood Conservation District submitted a request for a Section 401 Water Quality Certification (WQC) under the Federal Clean Water Act for the Slavens Western Pond Turtle Habitat Project, Klickitat County, Washington. The following required processing dates are referenced below:

- On March 10, 2022, the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (Corps) sent an email notification to Ecology that they are reviewing the project for authorization under Nationwide Permit No. 27 and requires an individual Section 401.
- On June 13, 2022 Ecology issued a public notice for the project.
- On June 28, 2022, the Corps provided an extension of the "Reasonable Period of Time" (deadline) for the WQC to August 5, 2022.

This project proposes to impact 4.23 acres of wetlands and will create ponds and grading to help restore and enhance historic wetlands on a field that was historically ditched and drained for agriculture. This field is adjacent to a state-owned wildlife area that is managed for the benefit of western pond turtles endemic to the site, as well as other wetland organisms.

The project site is located at 238 Old Highway 8, Lyle, WA, 98635, USA Columbia River, Klickitat County, Washington, Section 29, Township 3 N., Range 12 E., within Water Resource Inventory Area (WRIA) 29 - Wind - White Salmon.

With this Order, Ecology is granting Underwood Conservation District's request for a Section 401 Water Quality Certification for the Slavens Western Pond Turtle Habitat Enhancement project, provided that the activity is conducted in accordance with the Section 401 Water Quality Certification request and attachments Ecology received on February 23, 2022.

Based on the information submitted, Ecology has determined that the discharge from the project will comply with state water quality requirements. Prior to undertaking any changes that materially alter the project, Underwood Conservation District must contact Ecology to determine whether a new Section 401 Water Quality Certification is required.

Issuance of this Section 401 Water Quality Certification for this proposal does not authorize Underwood Conservation District to exceed applicable state water quality standards (Chapter

173-201A WAC), ground water quality standards (Chapter 173-200 WAC), or sediment quality standards (Chapter 173-204 WAC). Furthermore, nothing in this Section 401 Water Quality Certification absolves the Applicant from liability for contamination and any subsequent cleanup of surface waters, ground waters, or sediments resulting from project construction or operations.

In view of the foregoing and in accordance with 33 U.S.C. §1341, RCW 90.48.120, RCW 90.48.260 Chapter 173-200 WAC and Chapter 173-201A WAC, this WQC is granted to the Underwood Conservation District for the Slavens Western Pond Turtle Habitat project.

This Certification is not effective until the U.S. Corps of Engineers (Corps) Seattle District issues a Department of the Army (DA) permit for this project. Order No. **21240** will remain valid for the duration of the associated DA permit. Underwood Conservation District should send a copy of the final DA permit to fednotification@ecy.wa.gov within two weeks of receiving it.

Your right to appeal

You have a right to appeal this Order to the Pollution Control Hearings Board (PCHB) within 30 days of the date of receipt of this Order. The appeal process is governed by RCW 43.21B and RCW 371-08. "Date of receipt" is defined in RCW 43.21B.001(2). More information is available at https://eluho.wa.gov/content/11.

To appeal, you must do all of the following within 30 days of the date of receipt of this Order:

- File your notice of appeal and a copy of this Order with the PCHB (see filing options below). "Filing" means actual receipt by the PCHB during regular business hours as defined in WAC 371-08-305 and -335. "Notice of appeal" is defined in WAC 371-08-340.
- Serve a copy of your notice of appeal and this Order on the Department of Ecology, in paper form, by mail or in person. (See addresses below.) E-mail is not accepted.

You must also comply with other applicable requirements in RCW 43.21B and WAC 371-08.
