On June 17, 2022, Dennis W. Daley Trust submitted a request for a Section 401 Water Quality Certification (WQC) under the federal Clean Water Act for the Brookside Trails, Snohomish County, Washington. The following required processing dates are referenced below:

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- On May 12, 2022, the Dennis W. Daley Trust submitted a pre-filing meeting request.
- On June 22, 2022, Dennis W. Daley Trust submitted additional information and the Department of Ecology (Ecology) considered the Request valid on June 22, 2022.
- On July 8, 2021, the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (Corps) sent an email notification to Ecology that they were reviewing the project for authorization under Nationwide Permit No. 29, and requires an individual Section 401.
- On June 29, 2022, Ecology issued a public notice for the project.

This project proposes to develop 23 residential lots, an interior road, and a storm water detention facility. The project will cause 0.028 acres of direct impacts and 0.105 acres of indirect impacts to Wetland D, which will be mitigated at the Snohomish Basin Mitigation Bank by purchasing 0.069 credits. The culvert for a King Creek tributary will be replaced and a minor amount of excavation will occur when it is dry to realign the channel.

The project site is located at 6925 Sunnyside Boulevard, Marysville, Snohomish County, Washington, Section 2, Township 29 N., Range 5 E., within Water Resource Inventory Area (WRIA) #7–Snohomish Watershed.

With this WQC Order, Ecology is granting Dennis W. Daley Trust's request for a Section 401 Water Quality Certification for the Brookside Trails project, provided that the activity is conducted in accordance with the Section 401 Water Quality Certification request and attachments Ecology received on June 17, 2022.

Based on the information submitted, Ecology has determined that the discharge from the project will comply with state water quality requirements. Prior to undertaking any changes

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that materially alter the project, Dennis W. Daley Trust must contact Ecology to determine whether a new Section 401 Water Quality Certification is required.

Issuance of this Section 401 Water Quality Certification for this proposal does not authorize Dennis W. Daley Trust to exceed applicable state water quality standards (Chapter 173-201A WAC), ground water quality standards (Chapter 173-200 WAC), or sediment quality standards (Chapter 173-204 WAC). Furthermore, nothing in this Section 401 Water Quality Certification absolves Dennis W. Daley Trust from liability for contamination and any subsequent cleanup of surface waters, ground waters, or sediments resulting from project construction or operations.

Wetland Mitigation Conditions

- The Applicant shall mitigate wetland impacts as described in the Bank Use Plan for Brookside Trails, prepared by Ecological Land Services, dated January 31, 2021, (hereafter called the "Mitigation Plan") or as revised and approved by Ecology.
 - Justification Alteration of water quality necessitates the use of mitigation as a method of controlling pollution. When mitigation is provided, the impacts are not considered significant enough to water quality, at least in the long-term. The water quality standards, along with mitigation, protect wetlands as well as permitting some level of degradation where unavoidable or necessary.
 - Citation 40 CFR 131.12, 40 CFR 230, subpart J, Chapter 90.48 RCW, Chapter 90.54 RCW, Chapter 90.74 RCW, Chapter 173-201A-260 (3)(i-ii) WAC, Chapter 173-201A-300 WAC, and Chapter 173-225-010 WAC.
- Prior to impacting wetlands, the Project Proponent shall submit to Ecology documentation from the bank sponsor verifying the purchase of wetland mitigation bank credits from the Snohomish Basin Mitigation Bank. This documentation must include the Ecology Order number, Order issuance date, impact acreage, the amount of credits required by the Order, and date of credit purchase.
 - Justification This condition is necessary to ensure the compensatory mitigation was actually provided by the bank.
 - Citation 33 CFR 332, 40 CFR 131.12, 40 CFR 230, subpart J, Chapter 47.85.040 RCW, Chapter 90.48 RCW, Chapter 90.54 RCW, Chapter 90.74 RCW, Chapter 173-201A-260 (3)(i-ii) WAC, Chapter 173-201A-300 WAC, and Chapter 173-225-010 WAC.

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- 3. Unless otherwise authorized by this WQC Order, the Project Proponent shall complete the purchase of credits before impacting wetlands or Ecology could use its discretionary authority to require the Project Proponent to provide additional compensation to account for additional temporal loss of wetland functions.
 - Justification Mitigation that is not emplaced concurrent with impacts will result in degradation of existing beneficial uses of the wetlands affected by the proposed action through temporal loss of functions.
 - Citation 33 CFR 332, 40 CFR 131.12, 40 CFR 230, subpart J, Chapter 47.85.040 RCW, Chapter 90.48 RCW, Chapter 90.54 RCW, Chapter 90.74 RCW, Chapter 173-201A-260 (3) (i-ii) WAC, Chapter 173-201A-300 WAC, and Chapter 173-225-010 WAC.

In-water-Work Conditions

- 1. The Project Proponent shall obtain and comply with the conditions of the Construction Stormwater General Permit (National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System NPDES) issued for this project.
 - Justification Ecology must protect waters of the state from all discharges and potential discharges of pollution that can affect water quality to protect aquatic life and beneficial uses.
 - Citation 40 CFR 122 (delete CFR if NPDES is not EPA), Chapter 90.48 RCW, Chapter 90.48.030 RCW, Chapter 90.48.080 RCW, Chapter 173-201A WAC, Chapter 173-201A-300-330 WAC, Chapter 173-204-120 WAC, and Chapter 173-225-010 WAC.
- 2. The Project Proponent shall conduct water quality monitoring as described in the approved Water Quality Monitoring Plan (WQMP) for Brookside Trails, prepared by Ecological Land Services, Inc., dated August 10th, 2022.
 - Justification Ecology must protect waters of the state from all discharges and potential discharges of pollution and know if there are exceedances of the water quality standards that protect aquatic life and beneficial uses
 - Citation RCW 90.48, RCW 90.48.030, Chapter 173-201A WAC, 173-201A-300-330 and Chapter 173-225-010-WAC.

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In view of the foregoing and in accordance with 33 U.S.C. §1341, RCW 90.48.120, RCW 90.48.260 Chapter 173-200 WAC and Chapter 173-201A WAC, this WQC is granted to the Dennis W. Daley Trust for the Brookside Trails project.

This Certification is not effective until the U.S. Corps of Engineers (Corps) Seattle District issues a Department of the Army (DA) permit for this project. Order No. 21266 will remain valid for the duration of the associated DA permit. Dennis W. Daley Trust should send a copy of the final DA permit to fednotification@ecy.wa.gov within two weeks of receiving it.

Your right to appeal

You have a right to appeal this Order to the Pollution Control Hearings Board (PCHB) within 30 days of the date of receipt. The appeal process is governed by RCW 43.21B and WAC 371-08. "Date of receipt" is defined in RCW 43.21b.001 (2). More information is available at https://eluho.wa.gov/content/11.

To appeal, you must do all of the following within 30 days of the date of receipt of this Order:

- File your notice of appeal and a copy of this Order with the PCHB (see filing options below). "Filing" means actual receipt by the PCHB during regular business hours as defined in WAC 371-08-305 and -335. "Notice of appeal" is defined in WAC 371-08-340.
- Serve a copy of your notice of appeal and this Order on the Department of Ecology, in paper form, by mail or in person (see addresses below). E-mail is not accepted.

You must also comply with other applicable requirements in RCW 43.21B and WAC 371-08.
