Re: Coastal Zone Consistency for Auburn Logistics Center Project (Corps No. **20200789**) City of Auburn, King County, Washington

Dear Tyler Higgins:

On November 3, 2020, the Department of Ecology (Ecology) received a Certification of Consistency with the Washington State Coastal Zone Management Program (CZMP) for the above project.

On April 13, 2021, October 7, 2021, December 17, 2021, January 21, 2022, and July 13, 2022, Acquisition 44, LLC (Applicant) and Ecology agreed to stay the CZM in order to give the Applicant more time to meet the CZMP's enforceable policies. The July 13, 2022 (fifth) stay extended the review period until January 20, 2023.

This determination is for upgrading and modernizing an outdated distribution and logistics facility to improve systems capacity and meet modern operating needs. To resolve these issues, the north side of the building must be modified to incorporate new loading docks and improved truck access to accommodate truck maneuvering and access to support the distribution center operations. As the facility upgrades are location specific, impacts to the adjacent wetlands are unavoidable. The project proposes 5.05 acres of wetland fill and 1,377 square feet of ditch fill, for a total of approximately 5.1 acres of in-water and wetland impacts.

Pursuant to Section 307(c)(3) of the Coastal Zone Management Act of 1972 as amended, Ecology concurs with Acquisition 44, LLC 's determination that the proposed work is consistent with Washington's CZMP.

Your right to appeal

You have a right to appeal this decision to the Pollution Control Hearing Board (PCHB) within 30 days of the date of receipt. The appeal process is governed RCW 43.21B and WAC 371-08. To appeal, you must do all of the following within 30 days of the date of receipt of this decision:

- File your notice of appeal and a copy of this Order with the PCHB (see filing options below). "Filing" means actual receipt by the PCHB during regular business hours as defined in WAC 371-08-305 and -335. "Notice of appeal" is defined in WAC 371-08-340.
- Serve a copy of your notice of appeal and this Order on the Department of Ecology, in paper form, by mail or in person (see addresses below). E-mail is not accepted.

You must also comply with other applicable requirements in RCW 43.21B and WAC 371-08.
