On January 30, 2023, the WA Department of Transportation (WSDOT) submitted a request for a Section 401 Water Quality Certification (WQC) under the federal Clean Water Act for the SR 104 Shine Creek – Remove Fish Barrier in Jefferson County, Washington. The following required processing dates are referenced below:

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- On December 29, 2022, the WSDOT submitted a pre-filing meeting request.
- On January 31, 2023, WSDOT submitted additional information, and the Department of Ecology (Ecology) considered the Request valid on this date.

This project proposes to replace an existing 5 foot wide by 147-foot-long round metal culvert with a new 3-sided concrete box culvert (18 feet wide by 17 feet tall by 127 feet long). To remove the existing culvert and install the new one, a temporary detour lane and bridge will be constructed to shift traffic. The creek will be diverted around the work area utilizing a temporary bypass system and creating an isolated work area. Once the old culvert has been removed and the new one installed, the streambed materials will be placed, and the stream regraded to tie in with existing elevations on either side of the new structure. Large woody material will be placed in and on the banks of the creek to create habitat and disturbed areas will be seeded and planted.

The project site is located on SR 104 at milepost 10.36 in Jefferson County, Washington, Section 32, Township 28N., Range 1E WM., within Water Resource Inventory Area (WRIA) 17 – Quilcene-Snow.

With this Order, Ecology is granting WSDOT's request for a Section 401 Water Quality Certification for the SR 104 Shine Creek Fish Barrier Removal project, provided that the activity is conducted in accordance with the Section 401 Water Quality Certification request and attachments Ecology received on January 30, 2023. Based on the information submitted, Ecology has determined that the discharge from the project will comply with state water quality requirements. Prior to undertaking any changes that materially alter the project, WSDOT must contact Ecology to determine whether a new Section 401 Water Quality Certification is required. Issuance of this Section 401 Water Quality Certification for this proposal does not authorize WSDOT to exceed applicable state water quality standards (Chapter 173-201A WAC), ground water quality standards (Chapter 173-200 WAC), or sediment quality standards (Chapter 173-204 WAC). Furthermore, nothing in this Section 401 Water Quality Certification absolves the Applicant from liability for contamination and any subsequent cleanup of surface waters, ground waters, or sediments resulting from project construction or operations.

In view of the foregoing and in accordance with 33 U.S.C. §1341, RCW 90.48.120, RCW 90.48.260 Chapter 173-200 WAC and Chapter 173-201A WAC, this WQC is granted to the WSDOT for the SR 104 Shine Creek Fish Barrier Removal project.

This Certification is not effective until the U.S. Corps of Engineers (Corps) Seattle District issues a Department of the Army (DA) permit for this project. WQC Order No. **21619** will remain valid for the duration of the associated DA permit. WSDOT should send a copy of the final DA permit to fednotification@ecy.wa.gov within two weeks of receiving it.

Your right to appeal

You have a right to appeal this Order to the Pollution Control Hearings Board (PCHB) within 30 days of the date of receipt. The appeal process is governed by RCW 43.21B and WAC 371-08. "Date of receipt" is defined in RCW 43.21b.001(2). More information is available at https://eluho.wa.gov/content/11.

To appeal, you must do all of the following within 30 days of the date of receipt of this Order:

- File your notice of appeal and a copy of this Order with the PCHB (see filing options below). "Filing" means actual receipt by the PCHB during regular business hours as defined in WAC 371-08-305 and -335. "Notice of appeal" is defined in WAC 371-08-340.
- Serve a copy of your notice of appeal and this Order on the Department of Ecology, in paper form, by mail or in person (see addresses below). E-mail is not accepted.

You must also comply with other applicable requirements in RCW 43.21B and WAC 371-08.
