Re: Coastal Zone Management Federal Consistency Decision for I-405 I-90 to NE 6th Express Toll Lanes (Corps No. NWS-2017-0166) in King County, Washington

Dear John Lefotu:

On February 13, 2023, the Department of Ecology (Ecology) received a Certification of Consistency with the Washington State Coastal Zone Management Program (CZMP) for the above project.

This determination is for constructing new northbound and southbound express toll lanes on I-405, starting at I-90 Interchange (milepost 11.9) and extending to NE 6th Street (milepost 14.6). Additional road improvements include:

- Widening the I-405 overpass for SE 8th Street (milepost 12.78)
- Reconstructing the Main Street Bridge over I-405 (milepost 13.31)
- Constructing new overpass structures and section of trail for the Eastside Rail Corridor/Regional Trail (milepost 12.09 to milepost 12.49)

Road construction also entails stormwater management improvements as well as paving, restriping, and signal work. Compensatory mitigation will be provided for all unavoidable wetland impacts. This section of I-405 is located within the Renton/Bellevue area in King County, Washington.

Pursuant to Section 307(c)(3) of the Coastal Zone Management Act of 1972 as amended, Ecology concurs with WA Department of Transportation's determination that the proposed work is consistent with Washington's CZMP. Corps No. NWS-2017-0166-DOT, Aquatics ID No. 135783 March 16, 2023 Page 2 of 3

Your right to appeal

You have a right to appeal this decision to the Pollution Control Hearing Board (PCHB) within 30 days of the date of receipt. The appeal process is governed RCW 43.21B and WAC 371-08. To appeal, you must do all of the following within 30 days of the date of receipt of this decision:

- File your notice of appeal and a copy of this Order with the PCHB (see filing options below). "Filing" means actual receipt by the PCHB during regular business hours as defined in WAC 371-08-305 and -335. "Notice of appeal" is defined in WAC 371-08-340.
- Serve a copy of your notice of appeal and this Order on the Department of Ecology, in paper form, by mail or in person (see addresses below). E-mail is not accepted.

You must also comply with other applicable requirements in RCW 43.21B and WAC 371-08.
