Re: Coastal Zone Management Federal Consistency Decision for Trenton Condominiums Pier Maintenance, (Corps No. 202200467), Kirkland, King County, Washington

Dear Dan McKay:

On February 21, 2023, the Department of Ecology (Ecology) received a Certification of Consistency with the Washington State Coastal Zone Management Program (CZMP) for the above project.

This determination is for the proposal to conduct the following repair work of a 578ft<sup>2</sup> pier:

- Remove solid wood decking and frames.
- Drive six 8-inch epoxy-coated steel piles.
- Replace the existing dock with grated decking material.
- Install new stringers, frames, and 789ft of 43% open-space grated decking.
- Add a 211ft<sup>2</sup> extension; the footprint of the pier will increase by 211ft<sup>2</sup>.

The project also includes a mitigation planting plan, which includes the planting of one Western Red Cedar, one Shore Pine, one Nootka Rose, and two Mock Oranges.

The project is located in Lake Washington, adjacent to residential property at 4605 Lake Washington Blvd NE, in Kirkland, King County, Washington; Section 17, Township 25 North, Range 5 West; WRIA 8, Cedar-Sammamish Watershed.

Pursuant to Section 307(c)(3) of the Coastal Zone Management Act of 1972 as amended, Ecology concurs with Dan McKay's determination that the proposed work is consistent with Washington's CZMP.

## Your right to appeal

You have a right to appeal this decision to the Pollution Control Hearing Board (PCHB) within 30 days of the date of receipt. The appeal process is governed RCW 43.21B and WAC 371-08. "Date of receipt" is defined in RCW 43.21B.001(2). More information is available at https://eluho.wa.gov/content/11.

To appeal, you must do all of the following within 30 days of the date of receipt of this decision:

- File your notice of appeal and a copy of this Order with the PCHB (see filing options below). "Filing" means actual receipt by the PCHB during regular business hours as defined in WAC 371-08-305 and -335. "Notice of appeal" is defined in WAC 371-08-340.
- Serve a copy of your notice of appeal and this Order on the Department of Ecology, in paper form, by mail or in person (see addresses below). E-mail is not accepted.

You must also comply with other applicable requirements in RCW 43.21B and WAC 371-08.
