WA Department of Transportation (WSDOT) submitted a request for a Section 401 Water Quality Certification (WQC) under the federal Clean Water Act for the SR 14/I-205 to SE 164<sup>th</sup> Avenue Auxiliary Lane project in Clark County, Washington. The following required processing dates are referenced below:

- On January 3, 2023, WSDOT submitted a pre-filing meeting request.
- On February 14, 2023, Ecology received a request for Clean Water Section 401 Water Quality Certification.
- On March 20, 2023, Ecology issued a public notice for the project.

This project proposes to construct auxiliary lanes in both directions on SR 14 between from milepost 5.98 to milepost 8.75, increasing the number of lanes from 2 to 3 in each direction. The westbound SR 14 off-ramps will be modified to help improve traffic flow exiting on to I-205 for both northbound and southbound directions. Additional project elements also include constructing noise walls, stormwater facilities, new roadside drainage ditches, extending 2 culverts to the north and building 4 energy dissipater pads at the downstream end of 4 culverts that convey unnamed streams or drainages under SR 14. The project will result in unavoidable impacts to wetlands that will be mitigated for at the Columbia River Wetland Mitigation Bank and temporary impacts will be restored on site.

The project site is located on SR 14 starting at milepost 5.98 and extending to milepost 8.75 located in Clark County, Washington, Section 1, 2, and 3, Township 1-0N., Range 2-0E., within Water Resource Inventory Area (WRIA) 28 Salmon-Washougal.

With this WQC Order, Ecology is granting WSDOT's request for a Section 401 Water Quality Certification for the SR 15/I-205 to SE 164<sup>th</sup> Avenue Auxiliary Lane project, provided that the activity is conducted in accordance with the Section 401 Water Quality Certification request and attachments Ecology received on February 14, 2023.

Based on the information submitted, Ecology has determined that the discharge from the project will comply with state water quality requirements. Prior to undertaking any changes

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that materially alter the project, WSDOT must contact Ecology to determine whether a new Section 401 Water Quality Certification is required.

Issuance of this Section 401 Water Quality Certification for this proposal does not authorize WSDOT to exceed applicable state water quality standards (Chapter 173-201A WAC), ground water quality standards (Chapter 173-200 WAC), or sediment quality standards (Chapter 173-204 WAC). Furthermore, nothing in this Section 401 Water Quality Certification absolves the Applicant from liability for contamination and any subsequent cleanup of surface waters, ground waters, or sediments resulting from project construction or operations.

In view of the foregoing and in accordance with 33 U.S.C. §1341, RCW 90.48.120, RCW 90.48.260 Chapter 173-200 WAC and Chapter 173-201A WAC, this WQC is granted to WSDOT for the SR 14/I-205 to SE 164<sup>th</sup> Avenue Auxiliary Lane project.

This Certification is not effective until the U.S. Corps of Engineers (Corps) Seattle District issues a Department of the Army (DA) permit for this project. Order No. **21687** will remain valid for the duration of the associated DA permit. WSDOT should send a copy of the final DA permit to fednotification@ecy.wa.gov within two weeks of receiving it.

## Your right to appeal

You have a right to appeal this Order to the Pollution Control Hearings Board (PCHB) within 30 days of the date of receipt. The appeal process is governed by RCW 43.21B and WAC 371-08. "Date of receipt" is defined in RCW 43.21b.001(2). More information is available at https://eluho.wa.gov/content/11.

To appeal, you must do all of the following within 30 days of the date of receipt of this Order:

- File your notice of appeal and a copy of this Order with the PCHB (see filing options below). "Filing" means actual receipt by the PCHB during regular business hours as defined in WAC 371-08-305 and -335. "Notice of appeal" is defined in WAC 371-08-340.
- Serve a copy of your notice of appeal and this Order on the Department of Ecology, in paper form, by mail or in person (see addresses below). E-mail is not accepted.

You must also comply with other applicable requirements in RCW 43.21B and WAC 371-08.
