Olympic Pipeline Company LLC submitted a request for a Section 401 Water Quality Certification (WQC) under the federal Clean Water Act for the Olympic MP 229.61 Schoolhouse Creek Depth of Cover Restoration Project, Cowlitz County, Washington. The following required processing dates are referenced below:

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- On September 30, 2022, the Olympic Pipeline Company LLC submitted a pre-filing meeting request.
- On November 10, 2022, Ecology received a request for Clean Water Section 401 Water Quality Certification.
- On November 22, 2022, Olympic Pipeline Company LLC submitted additional information, and the Department of Ecology (Ecology) considered the Request valid on this date.
- On January 23, 2023, the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (Corps) sent an email notification to Ecology that they are reviewing the project for authorization under Nationwide Permit No. 12.
- On February 21, 2023, Ecology issued a public notice for the project.

This project proposes to restore depth of cover over our exposed 14-inch petroleum products pipeline at our crossing of Schoolhouse Creek by restoring the creek channel, extending approximately 70 feet downstream and 60 feet upstream of the pipeline crossing. Steps and pools will be created using a series of log and boulder steps downstream of the pipeline to restore approximately 2 feet of sediment cover over the pipeline.

The project site is located near 220 Sauvola Road, Schoolhouse Creek, Cowlitz County, Washington, Section 21, Township 6N., Range 1W., within Water Resource Inventory Area (WRIA) 27, Lewis River Watershed.

With this WQC Order, Ecology is granting Olympic Pipeline Company LLC's request for a Section 401 Water Quality Certification for the Olympic MP 229.61 Schoolhouse Creek Depth of Cover

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Restoration project, provided that the activity is conducted in accordance with the Section 401 Water Quality Certification request and attachments Ecology received on November 10, 2022, and the following supporting documentation:

- 1. Updated Critical Areas Report and Mitigation Plan received March 3, 2023.
- 2. Wetland Mitigation Bank Use Plan received March 28, 2023.
- 3. Water Quality Monitoring Plan (WQMP) received April 13, 2023.

Based on the information submitted, Ecology has determined that the discharge from the project will comply with state water quality requirements. Prior to undertaking any changes that materially alter the project, Olympic Pipeline Company LLC must contact Ecology to determine whether a new Section 401 Water Quality Certification is required.

Issuance of this Section 401 Water Quality Certification for this proposal does not authorize Olympic Pipeline Company LLC to exceed applicable state water quality standards (Chapter 173-201A WAC), ground water quality standards (Chapter 173-200 WAC), or sediment quality standards (Chapter 173-204 WAC). Furthermore, nothing in this Section 401 Water Quality Certification absolves the Applicant from liability for contamination and any subsequent cleanup of surface waters, ground waters, or sediments resulting from project construction or operations.

In view of the foregoing and in accordance with 33 U.S.C. §1341, RCW 90.48.120, RCW 90.48.260 Chapter 173-200 WAC and Chapter 173-201A WAC, this WQC is granted to the Olympic Pipeline Company LLC for the Olympic MP 229.61 Schoolhouse Creek Depth of Cover Restoration project.

This Certification is not effective until the U.S. Corps of Engineers (Corps) Seattle District issues a Department of the Army (DA) permit for this project. WQC Order No. **21695** will remain valid for the duration of the associated DA permit. Olympic Pipeline Company LLC should send a copy of the final DA permit to fednotification@ecy.wa.gov within two weeks of receiving it.

Your right to appeal

You have a right to appeal this Order to the Pollution Control Hearings Board (PCHB) within 30 days of the date of receipt. The appeal process is governed by Chapter 43.21B RCW and Chapter 371-08 WAC. "Date of receipt" is defined in RCW 43.21b.001(2).

To appeal, you must do all of the following within 30 days of the date of receipt of this Order:

• File your notice of appeal and a copy of this Order with the PCHB (see filing options below). "Filing" means actual receipt by the PCHB during regular business hours as defined in WAC 371-08-305 and -335. "Notice of appeal" is defined in WAC 371-08-340.

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• Serve a copy of your notice of appeal and this Order on the Department of Ecology, in paper form, by mail or in person (see addresses below). E-mail is not accepted.

You must also comply with other applicable requirements in Chapter 43.21B RCW and Chapter 371-08 WAC.
