Dear Lea Bonebrake:

On November 14, 2022, the City of Shoreline Public Works Department and Ecology agreed to a stay of the CZM until May 10, 2023, in order for the Applicant to comply with Water Pollution Control Act requirements.

This determination is for construction of a pedestrian and bicycle bridge in the vicinity of 1st Avenue NE that will span I-5 to the Sound Transit Lynnwood Link Light Rail Extension Shoreline South/148th Street Station. This will cause: 2,760 ft² of temporary impacts to Wetland A, 17,911 ft² of temporary buffer impacts [10,852 ft² Wetland A buffer and 7,059 ft² Thornton Creek buffer], and 1,616 ft² of permanent buffer impacts [1,036 ft² Wetland A buffer and 580 ft² Thornton Creek buffer]. These temporary wetland and buffer impacts would be restored after construction and 2,800 ft² of additional wetland buffer would be created on site as mitigation for permanent impacts.

The project site is located within I-5 right-of-way adjacent to 14738- and 14800-1st Avenue NE in the City of Shoreline, King County, Washington, Section 17, Township 26 N., Range 4 E., within Water Resource Inventory Area (WRIA) 8 Cedar-Sammamish.

Pursuant to Section 307(c)(3) of the Coastal Zone Management Act of 1972 as amended, Ecology concurs with the City of Shoreline Public Works Department determination that the proposed work is consistent with Washington's CZMP.

Your right to appeal

You have a right to appeal this Order to the Pollution Control Hearings Board (PCHB) within 30 days of the date of receipt. The appeal process is governed by Chapter 43.21B RCW and Chapter 371-08 WAC. "Date of receipt" is defined in RCW 43.21B.001(2).

To appeal, you must do all of the following within 30 days of the date of receipt of this Order:

- File your notice of appeal and a copy of this Order with the PCHB (see filing options below). "Filing" means actual receipt by the PCHB during regular business hours as defined in WAC 371-08-305 and -335. "Notice of appeal" is defined in WAC 371-08-340.
- Serve a copy of your notice of appeal and this Order on the Department of Ecology, in paper form, by mail or in person (see addresses below). E-mail is not accepted.

You must also comply with other applicable requirements in Chapter 43.21B RCW and Chapter 371-08 WAC.
