The City of College Place submitted a request for a Section 401 Water Quality Certification (WQC) under the federal Clean Water Act for the Lions Park Improvements project, Walla Walla County, Washington. The following required processing dates are listed below:

- On January 18, 2023, the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (Corps) sent an email notification to Ecology that they are reviewing the project for authorization under Nationwide Permit No. 27 and 42 and requires an individual Section 401.
- On January 25, 2023, the City of College Place submitted a pre-filing meeting request.
- On March 10, 2023, Ecology received a request for Clean Water Section 401 Water Quality Certification.
- On March 15, 2023, the City of College Place submitted additional information, and the Department of Ecology (Ecology) considered the Request valid on this date.
- On March 16, 2023, Ecology issued a public notice for the project.

This project proposes to construct water quality stormwater improvements by separating and restoring Garrison Creek flow from a recreational fishing pond, removing and replacing two pedestrian bridges to better accommodate creek flows, removing two stormwater outfalls and a low-head dam at the pond, and excavating the existing recreational fishing pond following restoration and separation of the creek flow. To accomplish these improvements, up to 135 cubic yards of dredge material will be removed over 2,305 square feet to remove the low-head dam and restore Garrison Creek using a bioengineered approach. In addition, up to 1,530 cubic yards of material will be dredged over 0.3 acres of the recreational fishing pond for the bridge removal and for enhanced fishing access following separation from Garrison Creek.

The project site is located at Lions Park within College Place, Garrison Creek, Walla Walla County, Washington, Section 36, Township 7 N., Range 36 E., within Water Resource Inventory Area (WRIA) 32 Walla Walla.

With this WQC Order, Ecology is granting the City of College Place's request for a Section 401 Water Quality Certification for the Lions Park Improvements project, provided that the activity is conducted in accordance with the Section 401 Water Quality Certification request and attachments Ecology received on March 10, 2023, and the following supporting documentation:

- 1. E-mail to Ecology dated March 15, 2023, regarding the project's documentation showing that the project's Pre-Filing Meeting Request was submitted at 30 days prior to submitting the project's section 401 Request.
- 2. E-mail to Ecology dated April 25, 2023, regarding the projects approved Final Water Quality and Protection Plan (WQMPP) dated April 13, 2023.

Based on the information submitted, Ecology has determined that the discharge from the project will comply with state water quality requirements. Prior to undertaking any changes that materially alter the project, the City of College Place must contact Ecology to determine whether a new Section 401 Water Quality Certification is required.

Issuance of this Section 401 Water Quality Certification for this proposal does not authorize the City of College Place to exceed applicable state water quality standards (Chapter 173-201A WAC), ground water quality standards (Chapter 173-200 WAC), or sediment quality standards (Chapter 173-204 WAC). Furthermore, nothing in this Section 401 Water Quality Certification absolves the Applicant from liability for contamination and any subsequent cleanup of surface waters, ground waters, or sediments resulting from project construction or operations.

In view of the foregoing and in accordance with 33 U.S.C. §1341, RCW 90.48.120, RCW 90.48.260 Chapter 173-200 WAC and Chapter 173-201A WAC, this WQC is granted to the City of College Place for the Lions Park Improvements project.

This Certification is not effective until the U.S. Corps of Engineers (Corps) Seattle District issues a Department of the Army (DA) permit for this project. WQC Order No. **21662** will remain valid for the duration of the associated DA permit. The City of College Place should send a copy of the final DA permit to fednotification@ecy.wa.gov within two weeks of receiving it.

Your right to appeal

You have a right to appeal this Order to the Pollution Control Hearings Board (PCHB) within 30 days of the date of receipt. The appeal process is governed by Chapter 43.21B RCW and Chapter 371-08 WAC. "Date of receipt" is defined in RCW 43.21b.001(2).

- Serve a copy of your notice of appeal and this Order on the Department of Ecology, in paper form, by mail or in person (see addresses below). E-mail is not accepted.

You must also comply with other applicable requirements in Chapter 43.21B RCW and Chapter 371-08 WAC.
