# In The Matter of Granting a Water Quality Certification to WA Department of Transportation pursuant to 33 U.S.C. 1341 (FWPCA § 401), RCW 90.48.120, RCW 90.48.260 and Chapter 173-201A WAC

Site Location	SR 160 Salmonberry Creek Fish Passage located on Salmonberry Creek, in Kitsap County, Washington.

WA Department of Transportation (WSDOT) submitted a request for a Section 401 Water Quality Certification (WQC) under the federal Clean Water Act for the SR 160 Salmonberry Creek Fish Passage in Kitsap County, Washington. The following required processing dates are referenced below:

- On 1/11/2023, WSDOT submitted a pre-filing meeting request.
- On 3/7/2023, Ecology received a request for Clean Water Section 401 Water Quality Certification.
- On 3/9/2023, WSDOT submitted additional information, and the Department of Ecology (Ecology) considered the Request valid on this date.
- On 4/10/2023, Ecology issued a public notice for the project.

This project proposes to replace the existing culvert under SR 160 (Sedgewick Road) with a new buried bridge structure consisting of secant abutment walls and void top slab. The new structure will be approximately 34' long with a hydraulic opening of at least 25'. The stream channel will be regraded to align with the new structure and tie into the stream channel upstream and downstream of the new bridge.

The work will result in temporary and permanent impacts to the stream and wetland but will replace a fish barrier culvert with a fish passable structure and restore stream riparian functions. The regraded section of stream will include large woody debris to provide in-stream habitat, replanting riparian areas with native species and reconnecting the stream with the adjacent riparian and wetland habitat.

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The project site is located on SR 160 at milepost 2.29 on Salmonberry Creek in Kitsap County, Washington, Section 11, Township 23 N., Range 1 E., within Water Resource Inventory Area (WRIA) 15 Kitsap.

With this WQC Order, Ecology is granting WSDOT's request for a Section 401 Water Quality Certification for the SR 160 Salmonberry Creek Fish Passage project, provided that the activity is conducted in accordance with the Section 401 Water Quality Certification request and attachments Ecology received on 3/7/2023, and the following supporting documentation.

1. E-mail letter to Ecology dated 3/9/2023, regarding the projects SEPA documentation and the pre-filing meeting request form receipt from Ecology.

Based on the information submitted, Ecology has determined that the discharge from the project will comply with state water quality requirements. Prior to undertaking any changes that materially alter the project, WSDOT must contact Ecology to determine whether a new Section 401 Water Quality Certification is required.

Issuance of this Section 401 Water Quality Certification for this proposal does not authorize WSDOT to exceed applicable state water quality standards (Chapter 173-201A WAC), ground water quality standards (Chapter 173-200 WAC), or sediment quality standards (Chapter 173-204 WAC). Furthermore, nothing in this Section 401 Water Quality Certification absolves the Applicant from liability for contamination and any subsequent cleanup of surface waters, ground waters, or sediments resulting from project construction or operations.

#### **Special Conditions:**

- 1. No petroleum products, fresh concrete, lime or concrete, chemicals, or other toxic or deleterious materials shall be allowed to enter waters of the state.
  - Justification Ecology must protect waters of the state from all discharges and potential discharges of pollution that can affect water quality to protect aquatic life and beneficial uses.
  - Citation Chapter 90.48 RCW, RCW 90.48.030, RCW 90.48.080, Chapter 173-201A
     WAC, WAC 173-201A-300 330, WAC 173-204-120, and WAC 173-225-010.

In view of the foregoing and in accordance with 33 U.S.C. §1341, RCW 90.48.120, RCW 90.48.260 Chapter 173-200 WAC and Chapter 173-201A WAC, this WQC is granted to WSDOT for the SR 160 Salmonberry Creek Fish Passage project.

This Certification is not effective until the U.S. Corps of Engineers (Corps) Seattle District issues a Department of the Army (DA) permit for this project. WQC Order No. **21757** will remain valid for the duration of the associated DA permit. WSDOT should send a copy of the final DA permit to fednotification@ecy.wa.gov within two weeks of receiving it.

# Your right to appeal

You have a right to appeal this Order to the Pollution Control Hearings Board (PCHB) within 30 days of the date of receipt. The appeal process is governed by Chapter 43.21B RCW and Chapter 371-08 WAC. "Date of receipt" is defined in RCW 43.21b.001(2).

To appeal, you must do all of the following within 30 days of the date of receipt of this Order:

- File your notice of appeal and a copy of this Order with the PCHB (see filing options below). "Filing" means actual receipt by the PCHB during regular business hours as defined in WAC 371-08-305 and -335. "Notice of appeal" is defined in WAC 371-08-340.
- Serve a copy of your notice of appeal and this Order on the Department of Ecology, in paper form, by mail or in person (see addresses below). E-mail is not accepted.

You must also comply with other applicable requirements in Chapter 43.21B RCW and Chapter 371-08 WAC.
