Re: Coastal Zone Management Federal Consistency Decision for Fugate Pier, Ramp, and Float (Corps No. 202200516), Wollochet Bay, Gig Harbor, Kitsap County, Washington

Dear Dong Jin Fugate:

On June 13, 2023, the Department of Ecology (Ecology) received a Certification of Consistency with the Washington State Coastal Zone Management Program (CZMP) for the above project. Pursuant to Section 307(c)(3) of the Coastal Zone Management Act of 1972 as amended, Ecology concurs with Dong Jin Fugate's determination that the proposed work is consistent with Washington's CZMP.

The proposed work includes the installation of a residential pier, ramp and float. The structure consists of: one 4' x 50' aluminum pier (4' x 47' overwater) with welded truss; one 3' x 40' aluminum ramp (3' x 34' overwater) with full side rails and decking with 100 percent fiberglass grating with 1.5-inch squares and 69 percent open area; and one 8' x 24' float with polyethylene foam filled tub flotation. The float surfaces are 50 percent composite decking and 50 percent fiberglass grating with 1.5-inch squares and 69 percent open area. Installation also includes two 8" galvanized steel piles, four 10" galvanized steel piles, and four pile mounted float stops designed to prevent grounding of the float. The total project consists of 482ft² of overwater coverage and the dock extends 105' from the existing concrete bulkhead.

The activity occurs within Wollochet Bay, on parcel number 0221193016, adjacent to 5216 Picnic Point Drive NW, near Gig Harbor, Kitsap County, Washington; Section 19, Township 21 North, Range 2 East; WRIA 15, Kitsap Watershed.

Your right to appeal

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You have a right to appeal this decision to the Pollution Control Hearings Board (PCHB) within 30 days of the date of receipt. The appeal process is governed by Chapter 43.21B RCW and Chapter 371-08 WAC. "Date of receipt" is defined in RCW 43.21B.001(2).

To appeal, you must do all of the following within 30 days of the date of receipt of this decision:

- File your notice of appeal and a copy of this decision with the PCHB (see filing options below). "Filing" means actual receipt by the PCHB during regular business hours as defined in WAC 371-08-305 and -335. "Notice of appeal" is defined in WAC 371-08-340.
- Serve a copy of your notice of appeal and this decision on the Department of Ecology, in paper form, by mail or in person (see addresses below). E-mail is not accepted.

You must also comply with other applicable requirements in Chapter 43.21B RCW and Chapter 371-08 WAC.
