Re: Coastal Zone Management Federal Consistency Decision for SR 109 Hoquiam to Ocean City – Remove Fish Barriers (Bundle 4/Site 7) project (Corps No. NWS-2023-0340-DOT), Un-named Tributary to Little Hoquiam River, Grays Harbor County, Washington

Dear Victoria Book:

On July 12, 2023, the Department of Ecology (Ecology) received a Certification of Consistency with the Washington State Coastal Zone Management Program (CZMP) for the above project.

This determination is for the project proposing to replace the existing 50-foot long, 36-inch diameter, circular concrete culvert with a 45-foot long, 13-foot 2-inch tall fish passable structure. Work entails diverting the stream so the existing culvert can be removed, and a new culvert installed. The stream channel, in the immediate vicinity and both upstream and downstream, will be adjusted to accommodate the new structure through excavation, placement of streambed material, and realignment as needed. Though the work will result in unavoidable temporary and permanent impacts to wetlands, the installation of this new culvert and construction of the stream channel will connect wetlands and streams resulting in improved ecological functions of the surrounding ecosystem. Additionally, installing LWD in streambed restoration areas will support salmon spawning and rearing habitat and restoring vegetation will create improved riparian areas along the creek. These improvements would be located on SR 109 at milepost 4.46 in Grays Harbor County, WA.

Pursuant to Section 307(c)(3) of the Coastal Zone Management Act of 1972 as amended, Ecology concurs with the WA Department of Transportation's determination that the proposed work is consistent with Washington's CZMP.

Your right to appeal

You have a right to appeal this decision to the Pollution Control Hearings Board (PCHB) within 30 days of the date of receipt. The appeal process is governed by Chapter 43.21B RCW and Chapter 371-08 WAC. "Date of receipt" is defined in RCW 43.21B.001(2).

To appeal, you must do all of the following within 30 days of the date of receipt of this decision:

- File your notice of appeal and a copy of this decision with the PCHB (see filing information below). "Filing" means actual receipt by the PCHB during regular business hours as defined in WAC 371-08-305 and -335. "Notice of appeal" is defined in WAC 371-08-340.
- Serve a copy of your notice of appeal and this decision on the Department of Ecology mail, in person, or by email (see addresses below).

You must also comply with other applicable requirements in Chapter 43.21B RCW and Chapter 371-08 WAC.
