Maintenance Dredging Project (Corps No. NWS-2023-147), within Coon Bay and Hood
Canal, Hansville, Kitsap County, Washington

Dear Ed Detmer:

On April 6, 2023, the Department of Ecology (Ecology) received a Certification of Consistency with the Washington State Coastal Zone Management Program (CZMP) for the above project. Pursuant to Section 307(c)(3) of the Coastal Zone Management Act of 1972 as amended, Ecology concurs with OPG Port Gamble, LLC's (Ed Detmer) determination that the proposed work is consistent with Washington's CZMP.

This determination to remove up to 18,000 cubic yards (cy) of accumulated sediment through maintenance dredging. Maintenance dredging is proposed to the authorized depth of -8 feet mean lower low water (MLLW) plus 1 foot of overdredge allowance and 1 foot of advance maintenance, to a maximum of -10 feet MLLW. Up to 11,000 cy of sediment dredged material would be beneficially reused as part of the Port Gamble Bay Habitat Restoration project (being evaluated under a separate application, NWS-2022-717), and the remaining amount would be disposed of at the Port Gardner Open Water Disposal Site. Dredged materials would be transported to the Port Gamble Bay Habitat Restoration site via the dredged material placement barge. In addition, up to 1,000 cy of finer-grained sediments from Coon Bay would be beneficially reused as upland soil amendment in backshore riparian planting areas at the former Port Gamble sawmill site. If dredge volumes from the Project outer entrance channel exceed the capacity of the Port Gamble Bay habitat restoration site, excess channel sediment up to a maximum of 5,000 cy, along with up to 2,000 cy of Coon Bay sediment would be disposed at the Port Gardner Open-Water Disposal Site located between the City of Everett and Whidbey Island.

The project also includes driving two navigation markers (12-inch-diameter galvanized steel piles) using vibratory pile driving methods.

The project site is located at Coon Bay, Hood Canal, Kitsap County, Washington, quarter section NE/SE, Section 19. Township 28 N., Range 2 E., within Water Resource Inventory Area (WRIA) 15 (Kitsap).

Your right to appeal

You have a right to appeal this decision to the Pollution Control Hearings Board (PCHB) within 30 days of the date of receipt. The appeal process is governed by Chapter 43.21B RCW and Chapter 371-08 WAC. "Date of receipt" is defined in RCW 43.21B.001(2).

To appeal, you must do all of the following within 30 days of the date of receipt of this decision:

- File your notice of appeal and a copy of this decision with the PCHB (see filing information below). "Filing" means actual receipt by the PCHB during regular business hours as defined in WAC 371-08-305 and -335. "Notice of appeal" is defined in WAC 371-08-340.
- Serve a copy of your notice of appeal and this decision on the Department of Ecology mail, in person, or by email (see addresses below).

You must also comply with other applicable requirements in Chapter 43.21B RCW and Chapter 371-08 WAC.
