Site Location	Liberty Road Swauk Creek Bridge Replacement project located within Wetlands, Swauk Creek and Williams Creek, Cle Elum, Kittitas County, Washington.

Kittitas County Public Works submitted a request for a Section 401 Water Quality Certification (WQC) under the federal Clean Water Act for the Liberty Road Swauk Creek Bridge Replacement project, Kittitas County, Washington. The following required processing dates are listed below:

- On 5/23/2023, the Kittitas County Public Works submitted a pre-filing meeting request.
- On 8/9/2023, Ecology received a request for Clean Water Section 401 Water Quality Certification.
- On 11/1/2023 the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (Corps) sent an email notification to Ecology that they are reviewing the project for authorization under Nationwide Permit No. 14 and 27 and requires an individual Section 401.
- On 11/7/2023, Ecology issued a public notice for the project.
- Ecology's "Reasonable Period of Time" for this project has been established as 2/29/2024.

This project proposes to discharge up to 1,632 cubic yards of dredge and fill material into 0.03 acres of wetlands, 0.14 acres of Swauk Creek, and 800-square feet of Williams Creek to replace the existing bridge, install a temporary bridge, and stream habitat restoration.

The project site is located near Cle Elum, Wetlands, Swauk Creek and Williams Creek, Kittitas County, Washington, Section 10, Township 20 N., Range 17 E., within Water Resource Inventory Area (WRIA) 39 – Upper Yakima River.

With this WQC Order, Ecology is granting with conditions Kittitas County Public Works' request for a Section 401 Water Quality Certification for the Liberty Road Swauk Creek Bridge Replacement project, provided that the activity is conducted in accordance with the Section 401 Water Quality Certification request and attachments Ecology received on 8/9/2023, and the following supporting documentation:

- 1. On 1/22/2024, Ecology received a Hydraulic Project Approval (HPA) that Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife issued on 1/11/2024.
- 2. On 1/23/2024, Ecology received a Water Quality Monitoring and Protection Plan (WQMPP), prepared by Jacobs Engineering Group, dated 1/23/2024.

Based on the information submitted, Ecology has determined that the discharge from the project will comply with state water quality requirements. Prior to undertaking any changes that materially alter the project, Kittitas County Public Works must contact Ecology to determine whether a new Section 401 Water Quality Certification is required.

Issuance of this Section 401 Water Quality Certification for this proposal does not authorize Kittitas County Public Works to exceed applicable state water quality standards (Chapter 173-201A WAC), ground water quality standards (Chapter 173-200 WAC), or sediment quality standards (Chapter 173-204 WAC). Furthermore, nothing in this Section 401 Water Quality Certification absolves the Applicant from liability for contamination and any subsequent cleanup of surface waters, ground waters, or sediments resulting from project construction or operations.

Special Condition:

1. Any work that causes distressed or dying fish or discharges of oil, fuel, or other chemicals into state waters or onto land with a potential for entry into state waters is prohibited¹. If such work, conditions, or discharges occur, immediately notify² Ecology's Regional Spill Response Office at 360-407-6300 and the Washington State Department of Fish & Wildlife with the nature and details of the problem, any actions taken to correct the problem, and any proposed changes in operation to prevent further problems. You will also need to notify the Washington Emergency Management Division³ at 1-800-258-5990, for spills to water only. This condition is necessary to prevent oil and other hazardous materials spills from causing environmental damage and to ensure compliance with water quality requirements. The sooner a spill is reported, the quicker it can be addressed, resulting in less harm.

In view of the foregoing and in accordance with 33 U.S.C. §1341, RCW 90.48.120, RCW 90.48.260 Chapter 173-200 WAC and Chapter 173-201A WAC, this WQC is granted with conditions to the Kittitas County Public Works for the Liberty Road Swauk Creek Bridge Replacement project.

This Certification is not effective until the U.S. Corps of Engineers (Corps) Seattle District issues a Department of the Army (DA) permit for this project. WQC Order No. **22490** will remain valid for the duration of the associated DA permit. Kittitas County Public Works should send a copy of the final DA permit to fednotification@ecy.wa.gov within two weeks of receiving it. To transfer this Order to a new owner or operator, complete a Request for Transfer of Order form following the instructions at the top of the form. Your right to appeal

You have a right to appeal this Order to the Pollution Control Hearings Board (PCHB) within 30 days of the date of receipt. The appeal process is governed by Chapter 43.21B RCW and Chapter 371-08 WAC. "Date of receipt" is defined in RCW 43.21B.001(2).

To appeal, you must do all of the following within 30 days of the date of receipt of this Order:

- File your notice of appeal and a copy of this Order with the PCHB (see filing information below). "Filing" means actual receipt by the PCHB during regular business hours as defined in WAC 371-08-305 and -335. "Notice of appeal" is defined in WAC 371-08-340.
- Serve a copy of your notice of appeal and this Order on the Department of Ecology mail, in person, or by email (see addresses below).

You must also comply with other applicable requirements in Chapter 43.21B RCW and Chapter 371-08 WAC.
