On March 28, 2016, the Washington Department of Ecology (Ecology) issued a 401 Water Quality Certification to the Port of Seattle for the above-referenced project pursuant to the provisions of 33 U.S.C. 1341 (FWPCA § 401). The WQC was amended the first time on July 22, 2020, to extend coverage to March 23, 2023; a second amendment was issued on July 14, 2021, to revise depth and volume of dredging; a third amendment was issued on December 22, 2022, to extend expiration date of the WQC for the wharf rehabilitation activities to continue through July 30, 2023, in order to complete the project; a fourth amendment was issued on July 28, 2023, to extend the WQC date through February 15, 2024, and to allow a one-time in water work window extension; and a fifth amendment was issued on November 22, 2023, to allow clean sand placement in response to an over-dredging event.

Ecology received a request on January 22, 2024, to extend the permit life from February 15, 2024, to July 30, 2024. Work after February 15, 2024, will include fender installation and slope settlement, to be conducted in the dry.

WQC Order No. 13195 dated March 28, 2016, is hereby amended as follows:

I. Condition number F2 which reads:

This Order shall remain in effect until February 15, 2024

Is replaced with:

This Order shall remain in effect until June 30, 2024

No other conditions or requirements of the above referenced Order are affected by this amendment.

Ecology retains continuing jurisdiction to make modifications hereto through supplemental order, if it appears necessary to further protect the public interest.

Failure to comply with this amended Order may result in the issuance of civil penalties or other actions whether administrative or judicial, to enforce the terms of this amended Order.

Your right to appeal

You have a right to appeal this Order to the Pollution Control Hearings Board (PCHB) within 30 days of the date of receipt. The appeal process is governed by Chapter 43.21B RCW and Chapter 371-08 WAC. "Date of receipt" is defined in RCW 43.21B.001(2).

To appeal, you must do all of the following within 30 days of the date of receipt of this Order:

- File your notice of appeal and a copy of this Order with the PCHB (see filing options below). "Filing" means actual receipt by the PCHB during regular business hours as defined in WAC 371-08-305 and -335. "Notice of appeal" is defined in WAC 371-08-340.
- Serve a copy of your notice of appeal and this Order on the Department of Ecology mail, in person, or by email (see addresses below).

You must also comply with other applicable requirements in Chapter 43.21B RCW and Chapter 371-08 WAC.


