Re: Coastal Zone Management Federal Consistency Decision for Petrogas Ferndale Pier Maintenance Activities 2023-2028 (Corps No. NWS-2023-0118), Strait of Georgia, Ferndale, Whatcom County, Washington

Dear Travis Linds:

On October 30, 2023, the Department of Ecology (Ecology) received a Certification of Consistency with the Washington State Coastal Zone Management Program (CZMP) for the above project. Pursuant to Section 307(c)(3) of the Coastal Zone Management Act of 1972 as amended, Ecology concurs with Petrogas Pacific, LLC (Travis Linds)'s determination that the proposed work is consistent with Washington's CZMP.

On April 3, 2024, Petrogas Pacific, LLC (Travis Linds) and Ecology agreed to stay the CZM until July 1, 2024, in order for Petrogas Pacific, LLC to meet the enforceable policy of the Water Pollution Control Act.

The proposed work includes maintenance, repair, and removal activities to a liquified petroleum gas and raw aluminum ore pier structure. Project activities include pile repairs (epoxy encapsulation and jacket repairs/extensions); pile replacement; modification/repair/replacement of appurtenant structures such as fenders, access points, and fire pump intake; dolphin pile and other obsolete pile removal; replacement of the north mooring dolphin; and other above-water maintenance actions (i.e. bracing, caps, corrosion protection, and pipelines). This activity would occur within the Strait of Georgia near Ferndale, Whatcom County, Washington.

## Your right to appeal

You have a right to appeal this decision to the Pollution Control Hearings Board (PCHB) within 30 days of the date of receipt. The appeal process is governed by Chapter 43.21B RCW and Chapter 371-08 WAC. "Date of receipt" is defined in RCW 43.21B.001(2).

To appeal, you must do all of the following within 30 days of the date of receipt of this decision:

- File your notice of appeal and a copy of this decision with the PCHB (see filing information below). "Filing" means actual receipt by the PCHB during regular business hours as defined in WAC 371-08-305 and -335. "Notice of appeal" is defined in WAC 371-08-340.
- Serve a copy of your notice of appeal and this decision on the Department of Ecology mail, in person, or by email (see addresses below).

You must also comply with other applicable requirements in Chapter 43.21B RCW and Chapter 371-08 WAC.


