On 8/30/2024, City of Medical Lake submitted a request for a Section 401 Water Quality Certification (WQC) under the federal Clean Water Act for the Coney Island Park Pier/Dock and Shoreline Stabilization, Spokane County, Washington.

On behalf of the state of Washington, the Department of Ecology certifies with conditions that the work described in the Water Quality Certification Request and supplemental documents complies with applicable provisions of Sections 301, 302, 303, 306, and 307 of the Clean Water Act, as amended, and applicable state laws. This certification is subject to the enclosed Water Quality Certification Order (WQC Order).

Please ensure that anyone doing work under this WQC Order has read, is familiar with, and is able to follow all of the provisions within the attached WQC Order.

City of Medical Lake submitted a request for a Section 401 Water Quality Certification (WQC) under the federal Clean Water Act for the Coney Island Park Pier/Dock and Shoreline Stabilization, Spokane County, Washington. The required processing dates are listed below:

- On 7/12/2024, the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (Corps) sent an email notification to Ecology that they are reviewing the project for authorization under the Nationwide Permit (NWP) Program.
- On 7/23/2024, the City of Medical Lake submitted a pre-filing meeting request.
- On 8/30/2024, Ecology received a request for Clean Water Section 401 Water Quality Certification.
- On 9/13/2024, Ecology issued a public notice for the project.
- Ecology's "Reasonable Period of Time" for this project has been established as 12/28/2024.

This project proposes shoreline restoration and the construction of a pier and floating fishing dock at Coney Island Park. The shoreline restoration will entail removing boulders, installing geofabric, and placing the boulders back in their original location. There will be additional rock fill. The proposed dock is 700 square feet. This includes a 20' x 25' fixed pier, a 20' x 5' floating walkway, and a 20' x 5' fishing dock. Drive 12 pylons for securing the fixed pier and 2 pylons for securing the floating dock.

The project site is located at 200 W Lake Street, Medical Lake, Spokane County, Washington, Section 18, Township 24 N., Range 41 E., within Water Resource Inventory Area (WRIA) 34 Palouse.

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With this WQC Order, Ecology is granting with conditions City of Medical Lake's request for a Section 401 Water Quality Certification for the Coney Island Park Pier/Dock and Shoreline Stabilization project, provided that the activity is conducted in accordance with the Section 401 Water Quality Certification request and attachments Ecology received on 8/30/2024.

Based on the information submitted, Ecology has determined that the discharge from the project will comply with state water quality requirements. Prior to undertaking any changes that materially alter the project, City of Medical Lake must contact Ecology to determine whether a new Section 401 Water Quality Certification is required.

Issuance of this Section 401 Water Quality Certification for this proposal does not authorize City of Medical Lake to exceed applicable state water quality standards (Chapter 173-201A WAC), ground water quality standards (Chapter 173-200 WAC), or sediment quality standards (Chapter 173-204 WAC). Furthermore, nothing in this Section 401 Water Quality Certification absolves City of Medical Lake from liability for contamination and any subsequent cleanup of surface waters, ground waters, or sediments resulting from project construction or operations.

Special Conditions:

- 1. This Certification is not effective until the U.S. Corps of Engineers (Corps) Seattle District issues a Department of the Army (DA) permit for this project. WQC Order No. **23343** will remain valid for the duration of the associated Corps permit for the project.
 - Justification Certifications are required for any license or permit that authorizes an activity that may result in a discharge or fill material into waters. This WQC Order is not valid until the Federal agency issues a permit. Additionally, Ecology needs to be able to specify how long the WQC Order will be in effect.
 - Citation Chapter 90.48 RCW, Chapter 173-201A WAC, and WAC 173-225-010.
- City of Medical Lake shall send a copy of the final Federal permit via e-mail to <u>fednotification@ecy.wa.gov</u> and cc to Federal Permit Manager prior to the starting of any work authorized by this WQC Order. If the Federal Agency determines the proposed project does not require a Federal permit, City of Medical Lake shall immediately inform Ecology.
 - Justification This condition is needed to ensure that the federal permit has been issued and all the conditions of the WQC Order have been included into the federal permit.
 - Citation 40 CFR 121.10, 40 CFR 121.11, and Chapter 90.48 RCW.
- 3. If water quality exceedances for turbidity are observed outside the point of compliance, work shall cease immediately and City of Medical Lake or the contractor shall assess the

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cause of the water quality problem and take immediate action to stop, contain, and correct the problem and prevent further water quality turbidity exceedances.

- Justification Ecology must protect waters of the state from all discharges and potential discharges of pollution and prevent exceedances of the water quality standards that protect aquatic life and beneficial uses.
- Citation Chapter 90.48 RCW, RCW 90.48.030, RCW 90.48.080, Chapter 173-201A
 WAC, WAC 173-201A-300 330, WAC 173-204-120, and WAC 173-225-010.
- 4. Visible turbidity anywhere beyond the temporary area of mixing (point of compliance) from the activity, shall be considered an exceedance of the standard.
 - Justification Ecology must protect waters of the state from all discharges and potential discharges of pollution and prevent exceedances of the water quality standards that protect aquatic life and beneficial uses.
 - Citation Chapter 90.48 RCW, RCW 90.48.030, RCW 90.48.080, Chapter 173-201A
 WAC, WAC 173-201A-300 330, WAC 173-204-120, and WAC 173-225-010.
- 5. Monitoring results shall be submitted to <u>fednotification@ecy.wa.gov</u> and cc to <u>Taylor.Belisle@ecy.wa.gov</u> once the project is complete.
 - Justification Ecology must protect waters of the state from all discharges and potential discharges of pollution and prevent exceedances of the water quality standards that protect aquatic life and beneficial uses.
 - Citation Chapter 90.48 RCW, RCW 90.48.030, RCW 90.48.080, Chapter 173-201A
 WAC, WAC 173-201A-300 330, WAC 173-204-120, and WAC 173-225-010.
- 6. To transfer this WQC Order to a new owner or operator City of Medical Lake shall:
 - a. Complete a Request for Transfer of Order with a specific transfer date of the WQC Order's obligations, coverage, and liability and submit it to Ecology at <u>fednotification@ecy.wa.gov</u> and cc to Federal Permit Manager. Link to form: https://apps.ecology.wa.gov/publications/SummaryPages/ECY070695.html;
 - b. Provide a copy of this WQC Order to the new owner or operator; and
 - c. The transfer is not considered valid until City of Medical Lake receives written notification from Ecology that the transfer has been approved.

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- Justification Ecology has independent state authority to ensure protection of state water quality. Ecology needs to ensure that anyone conducting work at the project, including any new owners or operators, are aware of and understand the required conditions of this WQC Order to ensure compliance with the water quality standards and other applicable state laws.
- Citation 40 CFR 121.5, Chapter 90.48 RCW, RCW 90.48.030, Chapter 173-201A WAC, and WAC 173-225-010.
- 7. Any work that causes distressed or dying fish or discharges of oil, fuel, or other chemicals into state waters or onto land with a potential for entry into state waters is prohibited. If such work, conditions, or discharges occur, immediately notify Ecology's Regional Spill Response Office at 360-407-6300 and the Washington State Department of Fish & Wildlife with the nature and details of the problem, any actions taken to correct the problem, and any proposed changes in operation to prevent further problems. You will also need to notify the Washington Emergency Management Division at 1-800-258-5990, for spills to water only. This condition is necessary to prevent oil and other hazardous materials spills from causing environmental damage and to ensure compliance with water quality requirements. The sooner a spill is reported, the quicker it can be addressed, resulting in less harm.
 - Justification This condition is necessary to prevent oil and hazardous materials spills from causing environmental damage and to ensure compliance with water quality requirements. In view of the foregoing and in accordance with 33 U.S.C. §1341, RCW 90.48.120, RCW 90.48.260 Chapter 173-200 WAC and Chapter 173-201A WAC, this WQC is granted with conditions to the City of Medical Lake for the Coney Island Park Pier/Dock and Shoreline Stabilization project.

Your right to appeal

You have a right to appeal this Order to the Pollution Control Hearings Board (PCHB) within 30 days of the date of receipt. The appeal process is governed by RCW 43.21B and WAC 371-08. "Date of receipt" is defined in Chapter 43.21B.001(2) RCW.

To appeal, you must do all of the following within 30 days of the date of receipt of this Order:

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- File your notice of appeal and a copy of this Order with the PCHB (see filing information below). "Filing" means actual receipt by the PCHB during regular business hours as defined in Chapter 371-08-305 WAC and -335. "Notice of appeal" is defined in Chapter 371-08-340 WAC.
- Serve a copy of your notice of appeal and this Order on the Department of Ecology by mail, in person, or by email (see addresses below).

You must also comply with other applicable requirements in Chapter 43.21B RCW and 371-08 WAC.
