Re: Coastal Zone Management Federal Consistency Decision for SR 20 Campbell Lake Rd Intersection Improvements - Roundabout (Corps No. NWS-2024-1041-DOT), Tibbles Creek, Anacortes, Skagit County, Washington

Dear Mark Stamey:

On December 20, 2024, the Department of Ecology (Ecology) received a Certification of Consistency with the Washington State Coastal Zone Management Program (CZMP) for the above project. Pursuant to Section 307(c)(3) of the Coastal Zone Management Act of 1972 as amended, Ecology concurs with the WA Department of Transportation's determination that the proposed work is consistent with Washington's CZMP.

The proposed work includes constructing a 3-legged roundabout at the intersection of Campbell Lake Road and SR 20 to improve safety and the flow of traffic. A section of Tibbles Creek will be rerouted through a WA Department of Transportation mitigation site away from SR 20, allowing the former stream channel to be converted for the stormwater conveyance. The new location of the stream channel will be forward compatible with a future culvert replacement and enhance both stream and wetland functions. This activity is located at SR 20, mile post 45.94 to mile post 46.22, on Tibbles Creek, near Anacortes, Skagit County, Washington.

Your right to appeal

You have a right to appeal this decision to the Pollution Control Hearings Board (PCHB) within 30 days of the date of receipt. The appeal process is governed by Chapter 43.21B RCW and Chapter 371-08 WAC. "Date of receipt" is defined in RCW 43.21B.001(2).

To appeal, you must do all of the following within 30 days of the date of receipt of this decision:

- File your notice of appeal and a copy of this decision with the PCHB (see filing information below). "Filing" means actual receipt by the PCHB during regular business hours as defined in WAC 371-08-305 and -335. "Notice of appeal" is defined in WAC 371-08-340.
- Serve a copy of your notice of appeal and this decision on the Department of Ecology by mail, in person, or by email (see addresses below).

You must also comply with other applicable requirements in Chapter 43.21B RCW and Chapter 371-08 WAC.
