Dear Randy Lewis:

On November 12, 2024, the Department of Ecology (Ecology) received a Certification of Consistency with the Washington State Coastal Zone Management Program (CZMP) for the above project. Ecology issued a 21-day public notice on February 11, 2025. Pursuant to Section 307(c)(3) of the Coastal Zone Management Act of 1972 as amended, Ecology concurs with Port of Grays Harbor's determination that the proposed work is consistent with Washington's CZMP.

On May 8, 2025, Port of Grays Harbor and Ecology agreed to stay the CZM review period until August 8, 2025 in order for the Port of Grays Harbor to submit the appropriate shoreline permits and approvals.

The proposed work includes demolishing and removing all four floats in the South Marina (Floats 15, 17, 19, and 21), one float in the Mid Marina (Float 11) and all the associated structures (piles, gangways, and approach piers). These five floats would be replaced with four new floats (Float 11, 15, 17, and 21), piles, gangways, approach piers, and other components. Float 19 would not be replaced. The existing structures are over 50 years old and nearing the end of their useful life. The new structures would be repositioned, re-sized, and reconfigured to reduce the number of slips but increase the size of the vessel that each slip can accommodate. This activity is located at 326 Lamb Street, Grays Harbor, Westport, Grays Harbor County, Washington.

## Your right to appeal

You have a right to appeal this decision to the Pollution Control Hearings Board (PCHB) within 30 days of the date of receipt. The appeal process is governed by Chapter 43.21B RCW and Chapter 371-08 WAC. "Date of receipt" is defined in RCW 43.21B.001(2).

To appeal, you must do all of the following within 30 days of the date of receipt of this decision:

- File your notice of appeal and a copy of this decision with the PCHB (see filing information below). "Filing" means actual receipt by the PCHB during regular business hours as defined in WAC 371-08-305 and -335. "Notice of appeal" is defined in WAC 371-08-340.
- Serve a copy of your notice of appeal and this decision on the Department of Ecology by mail, in person, or by email (see addresses below).

You must also comply with other applicable requirements in Chapter 43.21B RCW and Chapter 371-08 WAC.
