Taholah Remove Fish Barriers – Site 15 (Corps No. NWS-2025-0553-DOT), Un-named

Tributary to Pacific Ocean, Grays Harbor County, Washington

Dear Ben Ford:

On July 2, 2025, the Department of Ecology (Ecology) received a Certification of Consistency with the Washington State Coastal Zone Management Program (CZMP) for the above project. Ecology issued a 21-day public notice on July 16, 2025. Pursuant to Section 307(c)(3) of the Coastal Zone Management Act of 1972 as amended, Ecology concurs with Washington Department of Transportation's determination that the proposed work is consistent with Washington's CZMP.

The project will replace an existing round, concrete fish barrier culvert with a bridge. The new bridge is designed to accommodate a minimum hydraulic opening of 17 feet and provide an estimated gain of 2,677 linear feet of in-stream habitat. Other habitat elements include incorporating 9 pieces of large woody debris along the banks of the stream and constructing a step-pool channel with 15 step-pools on either side of and beneath the new bridge. Overflow channels will be located on either side of the primary stream channel and stream design includes installing energy dissipation boulders as well as scour countermeasures beneath a segment of the regraded stream channel. The new bridge will be supported on abutments and there will be wingwalls on either side of the bridge between the roadway and the abutments. Quarry spalls will be placed on the slopes for drainage and drainage ditches will be constructed as part of the roadway design.

During construction, the stream will be diverted to protect water quality during all channel work. Fish will be excluded from the work area by installing fish exclusion nets. All temporary impacts to the surrounding upland areas will be managed during construction using best

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management practices to control stormwater runoff and sediment erosion. At the end of construction these areas will be restored and replanted.

The project site is located on SR 109 at mile post 36.38 in Grays Harbor County, WA where an unnamed tributary to the Pacific flows under the roadway.

Your right to appeal

You have a right to appeal this decision to the Pollution Control Hearings Board (PCHB) within 30 days of the date of receipt. The appeal process is governed by Chapter 43.21B RCW and Chapter 371-08 WAC. "Date of receipt" is defined in RCW 43.21B.001(2).

To appeal, you must do all of the following within 30 days of the date of receipt of this decision:

- File your notice of appeal and a copy of this decision with the PCHB (see filing information below). "Filing" means actual receipt by the PCHB during regular business hours as defined in WAC 371-08-305 and -335. "Notice of appeal" is defined in WAC 371-08-340.
- Serve a copy of your notice of appeal and this decision on the Department of Ecology by mail, in person, or by email (see addresses below).

You must also comply with other applicable requirements in Chapter 43.21B RCW and Chapter 371-08 WAC.
