Re: Coastal Zone Management Federal Consistency Decision for SR 109 Ocean City to Taholah – Remove Fish Barriers Project (Site 14) (Corps No. NWS-2025-0089-DOT), Wain Creek, Grays Harbor County, Washington

Dear Ben Ford:

On August 26, 2025, the Department of Ecology (Ecology) received a Certification of Consistency with the Washington State Coastal Zone Management Program (CZMP) for the above project. Ecology issued a 21-day public notice on September 5, 2025. Pursuant to Section 307(c)(3) of the Coastal Zone Management Act of 1972 as amended, Ecology concurs with WA Department of Transportation's determination that the proposed work is consistent with Washington's CZMP.

The project will replace an existing concrete culvert with a bridge. The new bridge is designed to accommodate a minimum hydraulic opening of 27 feet and provide an estimated gain of 13,031 linear feet of in-stream habitat. Other habitat elements include installing four meander bars and approximately 38 pieces of large woody material. The new bridge will be supported on abutments and have a total of four wing walls, two upstream and two downstream. Enhanced stormwater treatment will be provided in three locations around the new bridge for roadway runoff.

During construction the stream will be diverted to protect water quality during all channel work. Fish will be excluded from the work area by installing fish exclusion nets. All temporary impacts from clearing and grading will be managed during construction using best management practices to control stormwater runoff and sediment erosion. At the end of construction, these areas will be restored and replanted with native vegetation.

The project is located on SR 109 at mile post 33.1 in Grays Harbor County, WA where Wain Creek flows under SR 109 to the Pacific Ocean.

Your right to appeal

You have a right to appeal this decision to the Pollution Control Hearings Board (PCHB) within 30 days of the date of receipt. The appeal process is governed by Chapter 43.21B RCW and Chapter 371-08 WAC. "Date of receipt" is defined in RCW 43.21B.001(2).

To appeal, you must do all of the following within 30 days of the date of receipt of this decision:

- File your notice of appeal and a copy of this decision with the PCHB (see filing information below). "Filing" means actual receipt by the PCHB during regular business hours as defined in WAC 371-08-305 and -335. "Notice of appeal" is defined in WAC 371-08-340.
- Serve a copy of your notice of appeal and this decision on the Department of Ecology by mail, in person, or by email (see addresses below).

You must also comply with other applicable requirements in Chapter 43.21B RCW and Chapter 371-08 WAC.
