RE: Coastal Zone Federal Consistency Conditional Concurrence for Corps Reference #NWS-2020-203, West Turnaround Contractor Parking Lot, Ferndale, Whatcom County, Washington

Dear Joe Murphy:

The Washington State Department of Ecology (Ecology) has completed its review of the Coastal Zone Management Act Federal Consistency (CZM Consistency) for the above-referenced project. This determination is for construction of a 4.2-acre gravel lot sized for approximately 500 parking spaces, a 30-foot access driveway, fencing, security turnstiles, landscaping, and a filtration/bioretention system for stormwater treatment, as well as relocation of approximately 432 linear feet of ditch to accommodate a new retaining wall. These improvements would be located at 3901 Unick Road, Ferndale, Washington, in Whatcom County.

On March 24, 2020, Phillips 66 Company Ferndale Refinery submitted a Certification of Consistency with the Washington State Coastal Zone Management Program (CZMP).

Ecology concurs that the proposal is consistent with Washington's CZM Program provided all applicable permits and approvals are obtained as described below. Phillips 66 Company Ferndale Refinery must ensure that this project is constructed and operated in accordance with all applicable federal, state, and local laws and regulations. If, prior to construction, the project should change significantly and any of the enforceable policies of the Washington's CZM Program would be affected, pursuant to 15 CFR §930.66, the applicant must submit supplemental information to Ecology for review and approval.

This concurrence is conditioned that Phillips 66 Company Ferndale Refinery obtains a Construction Stormwater General Permit.

YOUR RIGHT TO APPEAL

You have a right to appeal this decision to the Pollution Control Hearing Board (PCHB) within 30 days of the date of receipt of this decision. The appeal process is governed by Chapter 43.21B RCW and Chapter 371-08 WAC. "Date of receipt" is defined in RCW 43.21B.001(2).

To appeal you must do all of the following within 30 days of the date of receipt of this decision:

- File your appeal and a copy of this decision with the PCHB (see addresses below). Filing means actual receipt by the PCHB during regular business hours.
- Serve a copy of your appeal and this decision on Ecology in paper form by mail or in person. (See addresses below.) E-mail is not accepted.

You must also comply with other applicable requirements in Chapter 43.21B RCW and Chapter 371-08 WAC.
