Dear Maureen Colaizzi:

The Washington State Department of Ecology (Ecology) has completed its review of the Coastal Zone Management Act Federal Consistency (CZM Consistency) for the above-referenced project. This determination provides park infrastructure to improve public shoreline access, including: recreational floats and gangways, elevated boardwalks and viewing decks, pedestrian bridges, paths, boat storage pad, picnic pavilion and plaza, hand-carry boat access, improvements to an existing lagoon, plantings, habitat benches, fencing and signage. These improvements would be located at 7515 NE 175<sup>th</sup> Street, Kenmore, Washington, in Whatcom County.

Ecology initiated its CZM Consistency review on November 19, 2019, upon receiving a Certification of Consistency from City of Kenmore. Starting on April 30, 2020, Ecology and City of Kenmore agreed to three stays of the CZM deadline to allow time for the City to apply for a shoreline permit under the state Shoreline Management Act (SMA) and Construction Stormwater General Permit, as well as obtain a Section 401 Water Quality Certification. Under the agreement the current stay expires on September 30, 2020.

Pursuant to Section 307(c)(3) of the Coastal Zone Management Act of 1972 as amended, Ecology concurs with City of Kenmore's determination that the proposed work is consistent with Washington's CZMP.

## **YOUR RIGHT TO APPEAL**

You have a right to appeal this decision to the Pollution Control Hearing Board (PCHB) within 30 days of the date of receipt of this decision. The appeal process is governed by Chapter 43.21B RCW and Chapter 371-08 WAC. "Date of receipt" is defined in RCW 43.21B.001(2).

To appeal you must do all of the following within 30 days of the date of receipt of this decision:

- File your appeal and a copy of this decision with the PCHB (see addresses below). Filing means actual receipt by the PCHB during regular business hours.
- Serve a copy of your appeal and this decision on Ecology in paper form - by mail or in person. (See addresses below.) E-mail is not accepted.

You must also comply with other applicable requirements in Chapter 43.21B RCW and Chapter 371-08 WAC.
