IN THE MATTER OF GRANTING A WATER QUALITY CERTIFICATION TO Wiegardt and Sons, Inc. pursuant to 33 U.S.C. 1341 (FWPCA | Ocean Park, Pacific County, Washington |

On June 17, 2020, Wiegardt and Sons, Inc. submitted a request for a Section 401 Water Quality Certification (WQC) under the federal Clean Water Act for the Wiegardt Shellfish Farm - Mill Channel Farm, Pacific County, Washington. The Department of Ecology (Ecology) issued a public notice for the project on October 14, 2020.

Ocean Park, WA 98640

This project proposes to continue operation 17 acres of bottom Manila clam culture, 26 acres of on bottom oyster culture, and 12 acres on bottom oyster pipe culture. Manila clams are produced through natural recruitment. Manila clam harvest occurs by hand at low tide every 2 to 4 years depending on clam density and growth. Clam beds are maintained by a light frosting of gravel that is washed twice by the supplier.

On bottom oysters are produced through both natural recruitment and hatchery produced seed. For natural recruitment, the bed will be lightly frosted with clean oyster shell that has been aged for a minimum of 90 days. Frosting will occur when there is oyster larvae present in the water column and mature oysters have been previously removed from the bed. Frosting typically happens in July/August. Frosting with oyster shell will occur every 3 to 5 years. Hatchery produced seed is planted after the mature oysters have been removed. Oysters are harvested every 2 to 5 years depending on oyster density and growth. Oyster harvest will either be done by dredge at high tide or by hand at low tide.

On bottom pipe oyster culture consists of 2 foot long ½ in diameter schedule 40 thin wall PVC pipe. These pipes are stuck into the ground approximately 6 inches deep. Pipes are spaced three feet apart in rows. Each row is 100 feet long. Rows are 2 feet apart with a 4 foot gap between every 4 rows. Oysters naturally recruit (attach) to the pipes. Harvest will be done by hand at low tide. The pipe will be removed from the ground, the oysters will be broken off the pipe into a harvest tub and the pipe will be put back into the ground. Harvest will occur every 3 to 5 years.

The project site is located on tidelands within Willapa Bay on parcel numbers 79004000003, 79004000089, 79004000092, 79004000110, 12113455499, and 79004000001, adjacent to 23824 Sandridge Rd, near Ocean Park, Pacific County, Washington; Section 27, 34, and 3, Township 12N and 11N, Range 11W; WRIA 24, Willapa Watershed.

With this Order, Ecology is granting Wiegardt and Sons request for a Section 401 Water Quality Certification for the Wiegardt Shellfish Farm - Mill Channel Farm project, provided that the activity is conducted in accordance with the Section 401 Water Quality Certification request Ecology received on June 17, 2020, and the following supporting documentation:

1. E-mail letter to Ecology dated February 12, 2021, regarding compliance with the conservation measures associated with the "Programmatic Biological Opinions for Shellfish Activities in Washington State Inland Marine Waters" (U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) Reference Number 01EWFW00-2016-F-0121, National Marine Fisheries Service (NMFS) Reference Number WCR-2014-1502). This email also includes how Wiegardt and Sons Inc. will conduct water quality monitoring.

Based on the information submitted, Ecology has determined that the discharge from the project will comply with state water quality requirements. Prior to undertaking any changes that materially alter the project, Wiegardt and Sons, Inc. must contact Ecology to determine whether a new Section 401 Water Quality Certification is required.

Issuance of this Section 401 Water Quality Certification for this proposal does not authorize Wiegardt and Sons Inc. to exceed applicable state water quality standards (Chapter 173-201A WAC), ground water quality standards (Chapter 173-200 WAC) or sediment quality standards (Chapter 173-204 WAC). Furthermore, nothing in this Section 401 Water Quality Certification absolves the Applicant from liability for contamination and any subsequent cleanup of surface waters, ground waters, or sediments resulting from project construction or operations.

Any work that causes distressed or dying fish or discharges of oil, fuel, or other chemicals into state waters or onto land with a potential for entry into state waters is prohibited. If such work, conditions, or discharges occur, immediately notify Ecology's Regional Spill Response Office at 360-407-6300 and the Washington State Department of Fish & Wildlife with the nature and details of the problem, any actions taken to correct the problem, and any proposed changes in operation to prevent further problems. You will also need to notify the Washington Emergency Management Division at 1-800-258-5990, for actual spills to water only.

In view of the foregoing and in accordance with 33 U.S.C. §1341, RCW 90.48.120, RCW 90.48.260 Chapter 173-200 WAC and Chapter 173-201A WAC, this WQC is granted to the Wiegardt and Sons, Inc. Wiegardt Shellfish Farm - Mill Channel Farm project.

This Certification is not effective until the U.S. Corps of Engineers (Corps) Seattle District issues an individual Department of the Army (DA) permit for this project. Order No. 19734 will remain valid for the duration of the associated permit. Wiegardt and Sons, Inc. should send a copy of the final DA permit to fednotification@ecy.wa.gov within two weeks of receiving it.

YOUR RIGHT TO APPEAL

You have a right to appeal this Order to the Pollution Control Hearing Board (PCHB) within 30 days of the date of receipt of this Order. The appeal process is governed by Chapter 43.21B RCW and Chapter 371-08 WAC. "Date of receipt" is defined in RCW 43.21B.001(2).

To appeal you must do both of the following within 30 days of the date of receipt of this Order:

- File your appeal and a copy of this Order with the PCHB (see addresses below). Filing means actual receipt by the PCHB during regular business hours.
- Serve a copy of your appeal and this Order on Ecology in paper form by mail or in person. (See addresses below.) E-mail is not accepted.

You must also comply with other applicable requirements in Chapter 43.21B RCW and Chapter 371-08 WAC.
