Dear Karma:

The Department of Ecology (Ecology) has confirmed that a release of hazardous substances has occurred at the Closed Snipes Mountain Landfill facility (Site) requiring cleanup under the Model Toxics Control Act (MTCA), chapter 70A.305 RCW. This determination is based in part on a Groundwater Monitoring Report dated September 19, 2020. We have added the Site to our list of confirmed and suspected contaminated sites.

Based on credible evidence, Ecology is proposing to find Yakima County Public Services liable under MTCA for the release of hazardous substances at the Site. Any person whom Ecology finds, based on credible evidence, to be liable is known under MTCA as a "potentially liable person" or "PLP." This letter identifies the basis for Ecology's proposed finding and your opportunity to respond to that finding. This letter also describes the scope of your potential liability and next steps in the cleanup process at the Site.

Proposed Finding of Liability

Ecology is proposing to find Yakima County Public Services liable under <u>RCW 70A.305.040</u>³ for the release of hazardous substances at the Site. This proposed finding is based on the following evidence:

- 1. According to the Yakima County Assessor's website, Yakima County Public Services-Solid Waste is the current owner of Yakima County Parcel No. 221030311001, on which the Closed Snipe Mountain Landfill is located. The municipal landfill was closed in 1994 and Yakima County Public Services continues to conduct post-closure care environmental monitoring at the site. In addition, the Lower Valley Transfer/Recycling Station is located at this Site and is currently operated by Yakima County Public Services.
- 2. Groundwater sampling conducted at the Site on June 9 and 10, 2020, reported the presence of tetrachloroethylene—aka perchloroethylene (PCE)—in monitoring wells SMW-1 at 10.9 μg/L, SMW-4 at 5.93 μg/L, and SMW-5s at 2.63 μg/L. The concentration of PCE in SMW-1 and SMW-4 is above the applicable Model Toxic Cleanup Act (MTCA) cleanup level.
- 3. The presence of PCE in groundwater above the MTCA cleanup level constitutes a threat to human health and the environment and further action is therefore required.

Opportunity to Respond to Proposed Finding of Liability

In response to Ecology's proposed finding of liability, you may either:

- 1. Accept your status as a PLP without admitting liability and expedite the process through a voluntary waiver of your right to comment. This may be accomplished by signing and returning the enclosed form or by sending a letter containing similar information to Ecology; or
- 2. Challenge your status as a PLP by submitting written comments to Ecology within thirty (30) calendar days of the date you receive this letter; or
- 3. Choose not to comment on your status as a PLP.

After reviewing any comments submitted, or after 30 days if no response has been received, Ecology will make a final determination regarding your status as a PLP and provide you with written notice of that determination.

Identification of Other Potentially Liable Persons

If you are aware of any other persons who may be liable for the release of hazardous substances at the Site, Ecology encourages you to provide us with their identities and the reason you believe they are liable. Ecology also suggests you contact these other persons to discuss how you can jointly work together to most efficiently clean up the Site.

Responsibility and Scope of Potential Liability

Ecology may either conduct, or require PLPs to conduct, remedial actions to investigate and clean up the release of hazardous substances at a site. PLPs are encouraged to initiate discussions and negotiations with Ecology and the Office of the Attorney General that may lead to an agreement on the remedial action to be conducted.

Each liable person is strictly liable, jointly and severally, for all remedial action costs and for all natural resource damages resulting from the release of hazardous substances at a site. If Ecology incurs remedial action costs in connection with the investigation or cleanup of real property and those costs are not reimbursed, then Ecology has the authority under RCW 70A.305.060 to file a lien against that real property to recover those costs.

Next Steps in Cleanup Process

In response to the release of hazardous substances at the Site, Ecology intends to conduct the following actions under MTCA:

1. Ecology intends to initiate discussions for an Agreed Order for this site.

For a description of the process for cleaning up a contaminated site under MTCA, please refer to the enclosed fact sheet.

Ecology's policy is to work cooperatively with PLPs to accomplish the prompt and effective cleanup of contaminated sites. Please note that your cooperation in planning or conducting remedial actions at the Site is not an admission of guilt or liability.
