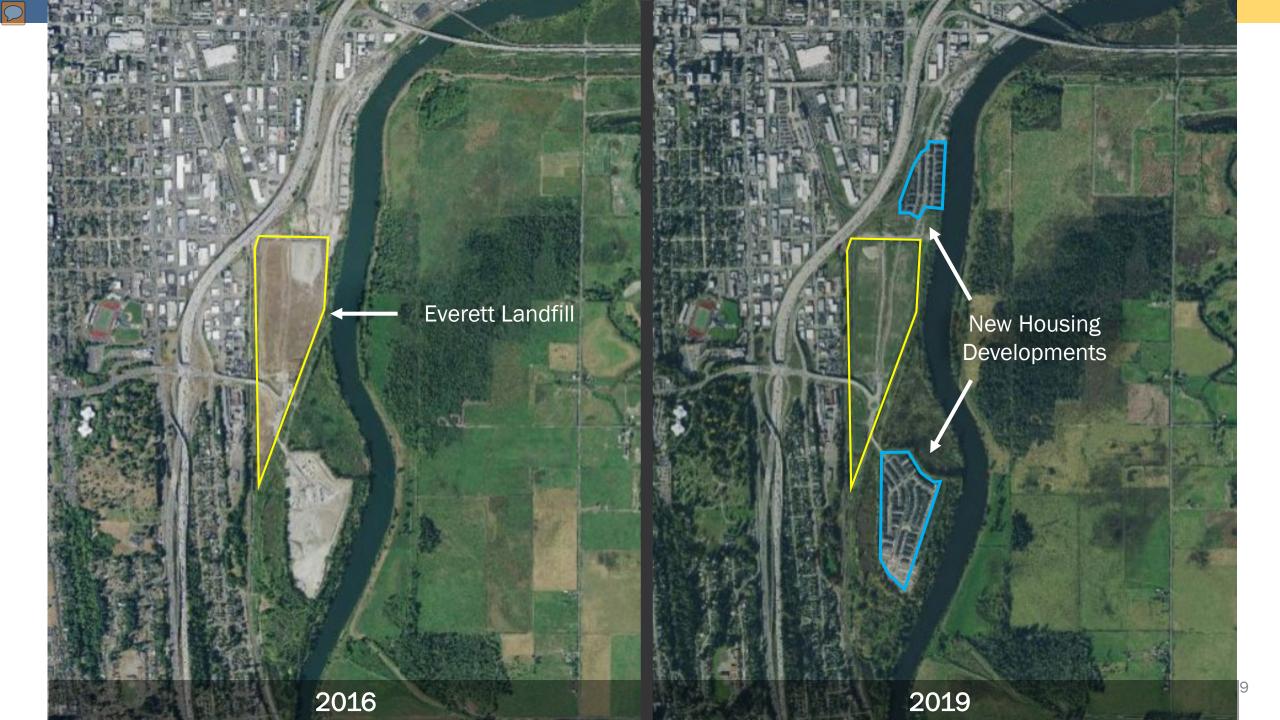




Ecology has 1 document for public review and comment through August 17, 2021:

Current Conditions





Everett Landfill Site History

- 70 acres, Municipal Landfill from 1917-1974
- After closure, used as a transfer station & tire storage
- Tire fires in 1983 & 1984
- Cleanup actions, 1993 2006, including:
 - covering and grading the landfill
 - construction and operation of perimeter gas and leachate collection systems
- Identified by City in Comprehensive Plan as economic development opportunity









Development Status

City of Everett

- New I-5 off-ramp and rail overcrossing constructed primary site access
- BNSF mainline relocated

Developer

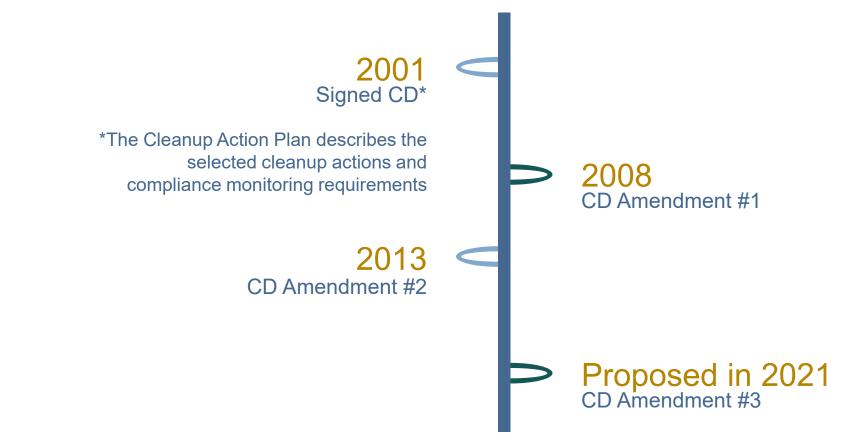
- Riverfront Boulevard Opened to public 2021
- Westside Site Work Construction underway, includes grading, paving, utility work
- Buildings A&B Construction underway, work/live units pending CD Amendment #3 approval

Timeline of Cleanup Legal Documents



CD = Consent Decree

CD Enforcement - Highlights



- The Cleanup action Plan (CAP), under the legal document CD, specified cleanup actions for the landfill under two scenarios:
 - when the landfill remains as an open space area
 - when the landfill is developed with buildings, road and parking lot.
- City and Ecology management and oversight to ensure compliance
- Monitoring data reported to Ecology annually, immediate notification if any triggers and corrective actions



Consent Decree/Cleanup Action Plan, 2001

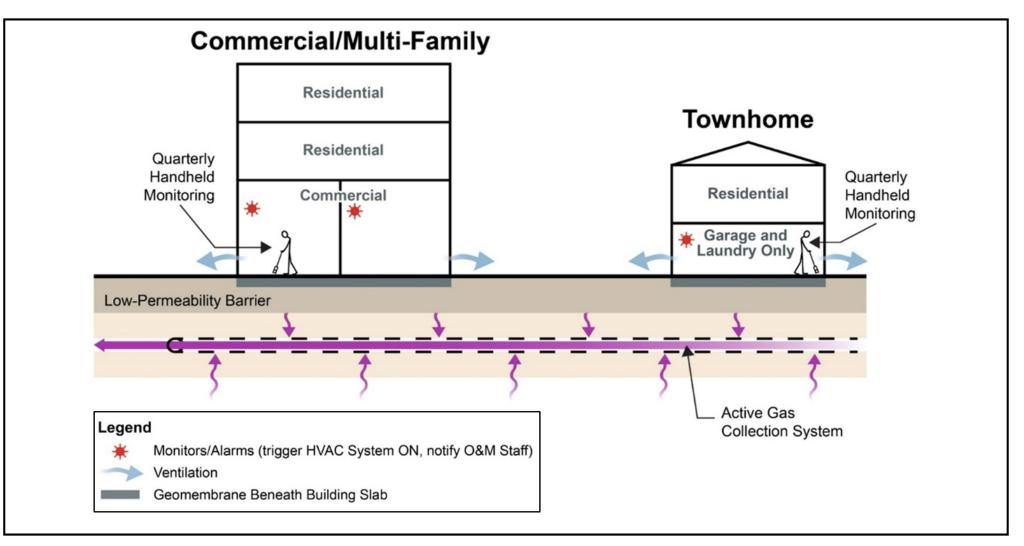
"Future use of the Site shall be restricted to commercial, industrial, mixed use, recreational, multi-family residential (upper levels only) or public access uses. The owner must notify and obtain approval from Ecology, or from a successor agency, prior to any use of the Site that is inconsistent with the terms of the Restrictive Covenant."



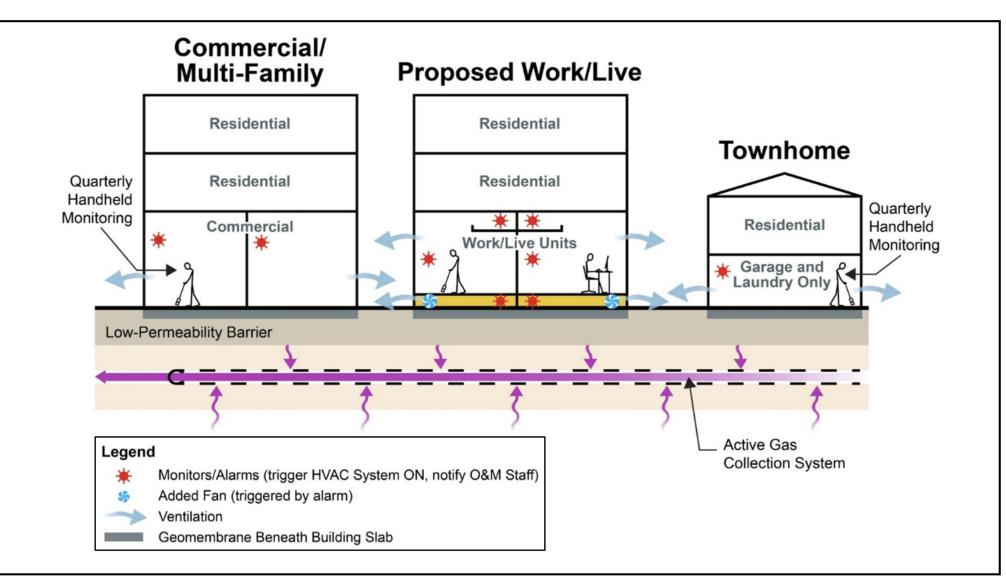
Proposed CD Amendment #3

31. *Riverfront may develop residential units at the Property* with ground floor uses restricted solely to garage, storage, and laundry; provided however, that *street level residential units* shall not be considered ground floor, and shall instead be considered upper level units, if they *are separated from the slab-on-grade by unoccupied and isolated monitoring/ventilation spaces* meeting the requirements of this paragraph.

Existing CD Requirements and Safeguards

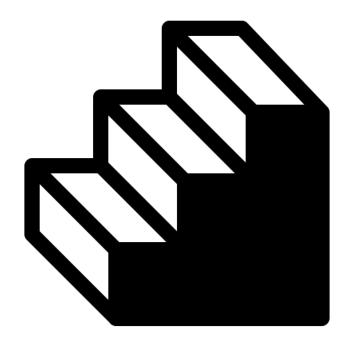


Proposed CD Amendment #3 – Additional Safeguards



Next Steps

- 30-day Public Comment Period for Consent Decree Amendment #3 (July 19 – August 17, 2021)
- Ecology responds to comments
- Based on comments, Ecology finalizes the legal agreement amendment
- The City and developer proceed with development and additional requirements
- Long Term Monitoring
