#### INTRODUCTION

The State of Washington, Department of Ecology (Ecology), International Paper Company (International Paper), and General Metals of Tacoma, Inc. (General Metals) entered into Agreed Order No. DE 17989 (Order) on May 27, 2020. The Order requires International Paper and General Metals (collectively the Subject potentially liable persons (Subject PLPs)) conduct a supplemental Remedial Investigation (RI) and update the Feasibility Study (FS) per WAC 173-340-350 and WAC 173-204-560.

#### MINOR CHANGE / AMENDMENT

Pursuant to Section VIII.L of the Order, Ecology and the PLPs hereby stipulate to amend the Order in this First Amendment to modify paragraph G (Updated FS) to the section VII (Work to be Performed) of the Order and the Order's Exhibit B (Schedule of Deliverables). This amendment to the Order does not result in a substantial change to the Order or its exhibits. This minor change to the Order does not attempt to recite all of the provisions found in the Order. Provisions of the Order not specifically changed in this modification remain in full force and effect. The minor change to the Order described below shall take effect upon Ecology's execution of this First Amendment.

### VII. WORK TO BE PERFORMED

G. Updated Feasibility Study. The Feasibility Study (FS) for the Site will be divided into two deliverables to address two areas at the Site. The first area (Area 1) is associated with the creosote related contamination on the site. The second area (Area 2) is associated with the remaining contamination on the site.

Area 1: For the area of the Site that is subject to Supplemental Remedial Investigation work required under paragraph A (Supplemental RI/FS Work Plan) of the section VII (Work to be Performed) of the Order, Subject PLPs shall prepare and submit to Ecology for review and approval a draft update to the June 22, 2018 Feasibility Study (Updated FS) that pertains to the creosote related contamination north of the blue line shown on Exhibit E that meets the requirements of WAC 173-340-350. Subject PLPs may consult with Ecology prior to writing the Draft Updated FS, to discuss the report outline. The Draft Updated FS shall incorporate the relevant data from the supplemental RI and the Revised Draft RI/FS, dated June 22, 2018, and include alternatives that address the creosote related contaminants on the Site. After making revisions based on Ecology's comments on an Agency Review Draft updated FS, Subject PLPs shall submit the Agency Review Draft Updated FS to Ecology no longer than 60 days from completion of the Supplemental

RI Report. Submit the Public Review Draft Updated FS that incorporates Ecology's comments within 30 days of receiving Ecology's comments on the Agency Review Draft Updated FS. To effectuate the work required by this sub-paragraph in the most efficient manner, International Paper has elected to take the lead in performing that work required under this Order. Language in this Order, and the exhibits attached hereto, may reflect this agreement among the Subject PLPs. However, the Subject PLPs remain strictly, jointly, and severally liable for the performance of any and all obligations under this Order. In the event the party identified as a lead should fail to timely and properly complete performance of all or any portion of its work, all Subject PLPs must perform that remaining work, if any

Area 2: For the metals recycling related contamination area of the Site (*see* Exhibit E), Subject PLPs shall prepare and submit to Ecology for review and approval a draft and final FS that meets the requirements of WAC 173-340-350 according to the Amended Schedule of Deliverables (Exhibit B). To effectuate the work required by this sub-paragraph in the most efficient manner, General Metals has elected to take the lead in performing that work, and the exhibits attached hereto, may reflect this agreement among the Subject PLPs. However, the Subject PLPs remain strictly, jointly, and severally liable for the performance of any and all obligations under this Order. In the event the party identified as a lead should fail to timely and properly complete performance of all or any portion of its work, all Subject PLPs must perform that remaining work, if any.


# AMENDED SCHEDULE OF DELIVERABLES
