 - The contractor (Clearcreek Contractors) continued dewatering and soil excavation efforts.
 - Overburden and contaminated soils have been trucked off site for disposal.
 - The Port continues to work with the contractor to manage the construction including processing the required project deliverables, Change Order Proposals and Requests for Information documents.
 - Collection and chemical analysis of confirmatory samples from the excavation base and sidewalls.
