SUBJECT ETMA facility / 95 Riverside Park, Redmond

SUMMARY I phoned Mr. McGraw to find out information about storm drains + sewer lines at this property location. We discussed the current data showing elevated levels of metals in groundwater and sources for it. Mr. McGraw said that ~~for~~ all SWS buildings should be discharging into Sanitary Sewer. They do not have a combined sewer overflow system. He suggested I call Bob Franklin (556-2815) for storm drain info. He would be interested in any data (GW) that we have for the area in question. He thought it would be unlikely that the contamination came from the Santa Clara Circuit (former) facility because too far + different contaminants, e.g., low pH. Mr. McGraw also recommended that I contact Metro Industrial waste inspector Arnaud Girard at 689-3012.

SUBJECT

ETMA/95 Riverside Park Facility, Redmond

SUMMARY

Mr. Girard said that ETMA have an authorized discharge with metro (began 7/91). They have a self-monitoring system which they sample for lead and PH on a quarterly basis. Their numbers are fairly low + insignificant (@ 40 gal./day). Mr. Girard conducted an inspection of this facility 6/27/91.

We discussed the possibility of an illegal discharge from ETMA - but probably unlikely. Their processing only includes lead (at least at this time) - so the presence of Arsenic and Chromium is still a mystery. Mr. Girard remembers that a consultant had called him within last year asking permission to discharge G.W. purge water into Sanitary sewer system. He recalls that the metals levels the consultant quoted him were high for G.W. He will try to find the telephone record for that request.

We discussed other sources of contamination besides ETMA. Mr. Girard said there are many facilities in that area that could contribute to the metals problem. He will send me a list of permitted facilities that discharge the 3 metals in question (Pb, As & Cr). He ~~offered~~ suggested that if we really suspect ETMA is the source, then we should dig test the drain and find out where the pipes go. The City of Redmond would need to be notified first.
