Dear Christopher Williams:

The Washington State Department of Ecology (Ecology) is writing to inform you that the above referenced property was subject to a site hazard assessment (SHA) as required under the Model Toxics Control Act, on 10/10/22. The site was determined to be contaminated with multiple chemicals including arsenic, lead, and polycyclic aromatic hydrocarbons. The site's hazard ranking, an estimation of the potential threat to human health and/or the environment relative to all other Washington state sites assessed at this time, has been determined by Ecology to be a 2, where a 1 represents the highest relative risk and 5 the lowest.

For your information, Ecology will be publishing ranking of this, and other recently assessed sites, in the February 2023 Special Issue of the Site Register. The hazard ranking will be used in conjunction with other considerations in determining Ecology's priority for future action at this site. This report is available on Ecology's webpage for Duwamish Waterway Park (<https://apps.ecology.wa.gov/cleanupsearch/site/15139>).

As part of the SHA, Ecology determined that the Duwamish Waterway Park Addition (CSID 15484) and the Duwamish Waterway Park (CSID 15139) would be combined into one site, named Duwamish Waterway Park, keeping CSID 15139. More details can be found on page 1 of the SHA report.
