Dear Dan Silver:

The Washington State Department of Ecology (Ecology) has been working with Dan Silver, the manager of the Trust for the B&L Woodwaste Landfill site, to manage control of the contaminants at the site. Floyd Snider, the environmental consultant for this project, prepared an "Agricultural Field Plume Remedial Evaluation", dated December 12, 2022, to propose additional cleanup work as part of an ongoing adaptive management approach toward remediation of the site under a 2008 Cleanup Action Plan (CAP). This work is being done under Consent Decree No. 082106107 between Ecology and the B&L Woodwaste Trust and in compliance with the Model Toxics Control Act, Chapter 70.105D RCW.

Ecology has reviewed the Agricultural Field Plume Remedial Evaluation for the B&L Woodwaste Landfill Site and is approving the recommendations within that evaluation. The recommended remedial approach includes filling the remaining ditch along the west side of the landfill and installing an in-situ treatment permeable reactive barrier to remediate arsenic contaminated groundwater leaking from the landfill. The full details of the proposed remedial approach can be found within the evaluation.
