





Cleanup Process & Public Participation

The Model Toxics Control Act (MTCA) directs the cleanup process.

Ecology has three documents ready for public review and comment.

Amendment to the Agreed Order (legal agreement)

- Updates the scope of work (for one of the interim actions)
- Updates the applicable laws and requirements for the Site

Revised Interim Action Work Plan

- Details the revised scope of work (for one of the interim actions)
- Outlines the schedule (for the same interim action)

State Environmental Policy Act (SEPA) Determination of Nonsignificance

 Ecology determination that the cleanup work is not likely to harm the environment

Site Background

- **1912 1973:** Northern State Hospital
 - Owned and operated by WA State
 - Treated psychiatric patients until 1973.
 - On the National Registry of Historic Places.
- 2014: Port of Skagit, City of Sedro-Woolley, and Skagit County partner to explore local ownership of property.
- **2015:** City of Sedro-Woolley annexed the property.
- 2018: Port of Skagit took ownership of the property from WA State.





Northern State Hospital 1912 - 1973






Site Operations

- Northern State Hospital had facilities to be self-sustaining
- Public access was restored in 2019 to designated outdoor areas of the campus
- Many buildings are currently leased to tenants by the Port
- The property is bordered by the Northern State Recreation Area







Site Future




- The Sedro-Woolley Innovation for Tomorrow (SWIFT) Center, a mixed-use campus for innovation and technology, is located on the property.
- Adaptive Reuse of the property will take multiple years and public / private partnerships.



Site Contamination

- **Contamination** is from operations at the former Northern State Hospital
- Testing from 2014 to 2021 identified seven areas of concern (AOCs)
 - AOC 1: Former Laundry Building
 - AOC 2: Power House Building
 - AOC 3: Trevennen, Coleman, and Denny Buildings
 - AOC 4: Former Ward Building Area and Athletic Fields
 - AOC 5: Metals in Soil
 - AOC 6: Maintenance Building
 - AOC 7: Lead and Arsenic in Groundwater

Site Contamination


Interim Actions (early partial cleanups) at the Site:

AOC 4

An Interim Action has been conducted at AOC 4 (Former Ward Building Area and Athletic Fields)

• AOC 1

An Interim Action is planned for AOC 1 (Former Laundry Building)





Area of Concern (AOC) 1

- Testing identified tetrachloroethylene (PCE) and trichloroethylene (TCE) in soil, groundwater, and soil vapor
- These chemicals have not been detected inside the building
- Building floor has been observed in good condition
- The Interim Action will mitigate potential inhalation exposure inside the building








Amended Agreed Order

- The Port and Ecology entered into an Agreed Order in 2019
- The Agreed Order included a scope of work for an Interim Action at AOC 1
- The Interim Action is changing so the Agreed Order needs to be updated
- The Amendment to the Agreed Order updates the Interim Action at AOC 1









Revised Interim Action Work Plan, AOC 1

The Revised Interim Action Work Plan for AOC 1 includes the following:

- Install a sub-slab depressurization system to prevent vapor intrusion
- Conduct monitoring to evaluate the system after startup
- Quarterly performance monitoring
- Reassess the system during the Feasibility Study

- Begin Feasibility Study

- Draft Cleanup
 Action Plan


