Dear Ms. Thomas:

The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, Region 10 ("EPA") has reviewed Baxter's Corrective Measures Study (CMS) – Revision 3, dated April 2013, submitted as a requirement of the abovementioned Order. This version of the CMS proposes chemical oxidation as a potential alternative for soil remediation at the Facility. Chemical oxidation has not been discussed in previous versions of the CMS and its effectiveness and feasibility at the Facility is unknown. If Baxter wishes to retain this alternative for consideration, Baxter must:

• Submit a work plan for a pilot study of chemical oxidation as a potential remedy at the Facility, including a schedule for its implementation, to EPA for review and approval within thirty (30) days of receipt of this letter.

or

• Provide references to published reports that support the efficacy of chemical oxidation for the matrices and contaminants at the Facility.

Please note that, as with any new alternative, EPA is not in any way endorsing chemical oxidation as part of the remedy for the Facility. Results of the pilot study must be provided and evaluated before EPA will consider this alternative.
