Thank you for working with the Washington State Department of Ecology (Ecology) on Anacortes Port of Dakota Creek (Site). This letter provides written notification that the Remedial Investigation/Feasibility Study (RI/FS), and draft Cleanup Action Plan (dCAP) required at the Site by Agreed Order No. DE-07TCPHQ-5080 (Order) under the Model Toxics Control Act (MTCA), Chapter 70.105D RCW, have been satisfactorily completed. The Order became effective on December 12, 2007. This letter also describes the next steps for the Site.

Completion of Remedial Actions Required by the Order

Ecology has determined the requirements of the Order have been satisfied. Ecology made this determination pursuant to Section IX (Satisfaction of Order).

The remedial actions required by the Order are specified in Section VII (Work to Be Performed). The Port of Anacortes was required to:

- Develop RI/FS work plans.
- Perform field data collection to fill data gaps identified in the work plans.
- Develop RI/FS reports.
- Complete an interim remedial action.
- Prepare a dCAP.

After inspecting the Site and reviewing the supporting documentation, Ecology has determined the remedial actions in Section VII have been satisfactorily completed.

Next Steps at the Site


Ecology has completed a dCAP for the Site. After review and consideration of comments received during the public comment period, Ecology issued a final Cleanup Action Plan (CAP) in July 2022.

The CAP will be implemented in a consent decree dated October 21, 2022. Negotiations and signing of the consent decree are complete, and Ecology looks forward to continuing this working relationship.
