Public Participation

Public review and comment: March 25 – April 23, 2024

- Agreed Order: legal document that requires the City to investigate environmental conditions, complete a Remedial Investigation, and if determined necessary after completion of the investigation, to prepare a Feasibility Study and a draft Cleanup Action Plan.
- **Public Participation Plan**: describes how Ecology will inform the community about site activities and ways to become involved.



Site Background

- Approx. 6 acres
- City-owned within Anacortes Community Forest Lands
- Former landfill property is managed by Anacortes City Parks and Recreation Department in coordination with Skagit County Public Health Department (SCPH)



Site Overview



Anacortes Community Forest Lands (ACFL)

- The City of Anacortes owns the approximately 6-acre property within the ACFL
- Access to the main portion of the property is currently restricted





Landfill Operations

Mid-1940s

- Landfill constructed
- 1960s-1970

Landfill accepted municipal solid waste that was burned on-site

1970s - 2006

 City used the landfill for storage and disposal of public works materials

- 2006
- All operations ceased and closed under
 SCPH oversight

Landfill closure, monitoring, and maintenance

2003-2006

- SCPH conducted Initial Investigation
- Site placed on Ecology's list

2008

- SCPH completed landfill closure actions
- SCPH developed 10-year postclosure plan

2009

- SCPH conducted Site Hazard Assessment
- Ecology issues
 No Further
 Action (NFA)

2010-2020

 SCPH performed routine monitoring and maintenance

Renewed Site Concern

- August 2019: Community questions about a proposed addition of a bike skills park on-site.
- November 2019: Ecology re-evaluated and concluded that additional sampling was needed.
- January 2020: Ecology withdrew the previous NFA determination.





Remedial Investigation Focus

- Completed investigations: Soil and groundwater seep sampling has been performed at the Site.
- Additional investigations: The Remedial Investigation Work Plan will assess data gaps and develop a plan for the Remedial Investigation.
