Dear Mr. Steinmetz:

On February 20, 1991, Ecology staff conducted a site visit at the Boise Cascade facility in Yakima. It was observed that Boise Cascade is continuing to operate a Woodwaste Landfill at their facility in Yakima without the benefit of a Health District permit. I have enclosed photographs showing the fill site which is located near the Yakima River and the Greenway Trail. Boise Cascade has been informed by representatives from Yakima Health District and the Department of Ecology of the requirements for woodwaste landfills in the past (see attached letter) so it appears that they are knowingly disregarding state and county laws regarding solid waste disposal.

We strongly encourage your department to take the appropriate action to stop the deposition of woodwaste at this site, and require the facility to close in conformance with Chapter 173-304 WAC. If you compliance, please do not hesitate to contact me at 454-7298.

Dear Ms. Hoy:





I am writing to you about the Boise Cascade's Woodwaste Landfill Facility in Yakima, Washington. This facility is out of compliance with state law, WAC 173-304. In the past, both Yakima Health District (YHD) and Washington State Department of Ecology (DOE) representatives have informed you about the law's requirements. It was our understanding that Boise Cascade would discontinue to use the facility and bring the site in compliance with state law.

On March 13, 1991, DOE informed YHD that Boise Cascade is continuing to operate its woodwaste landfill out of compliance with state law. YHD and DOE are concerned about the effect this facility may have on ground water quality. Due to the geology of the area, ground water quality is easily influence by surface actives. Many residents depend on this aquifer for their drinking water supply. One of the purposes of the state law is to safeguard the health of our citizens by protecting the quality of ground water. I hope Boise Cascade's apparent lack of action is just an oversite and it will bring the site into compliance with state law.

However, because of Bosie Cascade Corporation's lack of action, the Department of Ecology is requesting that the Yakima Health District take appropriate legal action to stop the deposition of woodwaste at the site in question and require the facility to close in conformance with WAC 173-304. This letter is the first step in that process.

Therefore, at this time, the Yakima Health District is requesting that Bosie Cascade Corporation stop the deposition of woodwaste at the site in question and close the site in conformance with WAC 173-304. It is further requested that Bosie Cascade Corporation comply with this request within 10 days after receipt of this letter. If Bosie Cascade does complied with this request prior to the 10 day deadline, please notify this office. If Bosie Cascade Corporation choses not to comply with this request, the Yakima Health District will have no other alternative but to seek court enforced compliance with state law.

I hope that Bosie Cascade Corporation and the Yakima Health District do not end up in court. However, options available to resolve this situation are limited by state law. If you have any questions, please call me at 575-4055.

RE: Former Boise Cascade Woodwaste Property

Dear Mr McEwen:

I am writing you in regard to the Boise Cascade Woodwaste facility. As you are aware, Boise Cascade Corporation has proposed the closure of their woodwaste landfill in Yakima. The area being proposed for closure is shown on the attached photocopy of an aerial photo. In our review of this proposal, we discovered neighboring areas which we believe have received woodwaste in the past. These areas are also shown in Attachment A. The southern area definitely has received woodwaste in the past several years (after November, 1985). We are unsure about the composition of fill in the northern area. The Department of Ecology requests that you determine the status of these facilities and when they will be closed in accordance with the Minimum Functional Standards, Chapter 173-304 WAC.

Our understanding is that the southern area in question may have changed ownership, either to the Greenway Foundation or to Yakima County. If so, these agencies should be made aware of the closure requirements. In either situation, a schedule for closure needs to be developed.

Ecology will gladly meet with you and/or the owners to further discuss the status of these areas and future closure activities. Please feel free to call myself or Rick Roeder at 454-7297.
