Description of proposal: Ecology is proposing the issuance and implementation of the revised Cleanup Action Plan (2024) for the former Lilyblad Site. The site includes areas of the former Lilyblad property as wells as parts of the Port of Tacoma Road and neighboring properties. The estimated total area of contamination is about 2.6 acres. The Cleanup Action Plan will implement biosparge technology followed by monitoring and natural attenuation and institutional controls. If needed, chemical addition may be used to assist with the biosparge treatment.
