We are holding industries, including the Lower Duwamish Waterway Group (LDWG, made up of the City of Seattle, King County, and Boeing), accountable for funding and implementing cleanup efforts. This includes addressing contamination and preventing further pollution. While the cleanup process is complex and takes time, we are focused on delivering lasting solutions.
