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#### Site history

Three underground storage tanks (USTs) were removed during due diligence activities in August 1999. Gasoline in soil could not be removed at the time because of risk to the building foundation. In 2024, additional interim action was taken to remove a few cubic yards of petroleum contaminated soil. Additionally, four monitoring wells were installed, MW-1 through MW-4. These wells have been sampled once, in December 2024. An air sparge line was connected from the source area (tank removal), with a blower system operating nightly. The Property continues to operate as a boutique shop.
