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Jiffy Cleaners occupied the southwest corner of the Fuel Center Property. Jiffy Cleaners operated from approximately 1966 to 2001. Initially, two limited site assessments were performed: one in 2001, which indicated that releases of chlorinated solvents and petroleum hydrocarbons impacted soil and groundwater at the Site; and a second assessment in 2002 to further delineate the magnitude and extent of impacts to soil and groundwater.

In 2003, the Fuel Center's seven underground storage tanks (USTs) were removed. Hydrogen-releasing compound (HRC) was placed in the remediation excavation prior to backfilling to promote anaerobic degradation of residual contamination encountered at

the limits of the excavation. During the 2003 removal action, approximately 15 to 17 feet of HVOC-contaminated soils were excavated from below the former dry cleaner and to the northeast. The presence of a retaining wall and subsurface utilities prevented further excavation to the south/southwest into the Safeway Store driveway.

Remedial investigation activities were conducted from 2017 through 2019. The 2017 activities defined the HVOC contamination as separate (not comingled) from the fuel stations' petroleum contamination.

Additional remedial investigation activities were conducted in 2022 to further define the extent of contamination in soil and groundwater, and soil vapor sampling was conducted in 2023.
