2025 Periodic Review Public Comment Period

Ecology held a public comment period from June 12th at 8:00 AM to July 15th at 11:59 PM, 2025 for public review and comment on the draft periodic review report. We received one comment. The draft periodic review report is now final.

Site Background

The site is an active shooting range that has been in use since 1967. There is contamination at the site, including lead (from lead shot) and polycyclic aromatic hydrocarbons (from clay targets).

Cleanup started in 2013 and included removing lead from active shooting areas and contaminated soil and sediment from a pond. Ongoing safety measures and maintenance prevent exposure to contaminants.

Since the site is still an active shooting range, lead levels will build up again over time. To address this, Ecology requests the property owner write a **lead management plan** describing how lead will be regularly removed from active shooting range areas.

Ecology is not requiring further cleanup at this time. However, Ecology provided guidance for ongoing operations at the shooting range:

- Property owner must test groundwater at least once before the next periodic review.
- Ecology recommends the owner looks into biodegradable targets for the shooting range.

The next periodic review will be in about 5 years.
