

Cleaning up Weyerhaeuser Mill A Port Gardner Bay



Cleanup at the Mill A site has been underway since the mid-2010s, and that work will continue for several more years. During this work there will be short-term impacts such as increased truck traffic, construction noise, and temporary air-quality changes from equipment operating on site, along with in-water activity that may briefly disturb aquatic life while contaminated sediment and debris are removed. These effects are expected to be temporary and managed through standard safety and environmental controls, but people working near the terminal or traveling through the area may notice periods of heavier activity as cleanup progresses.

The state awarded \$20 million to help clean up the Weyerhaeuser Mill A site, and because this is a major public investment, the project must go through an environmental justice review to make sure that the cleanup benefits nearby communities and addresses long-standing pollution impacts fairly. **Help us understand how we can reduce harmful impacts and address inequities.**
