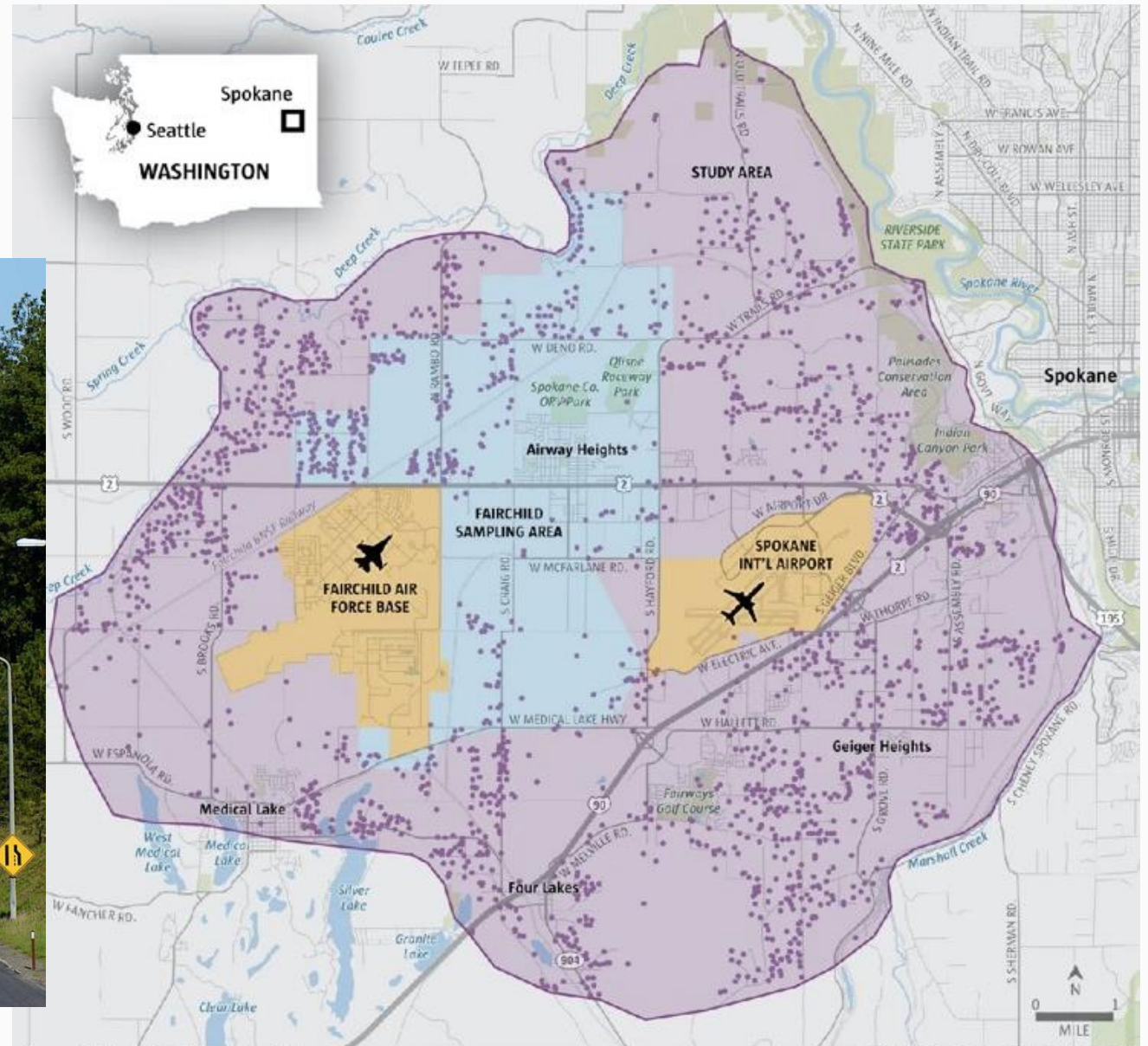

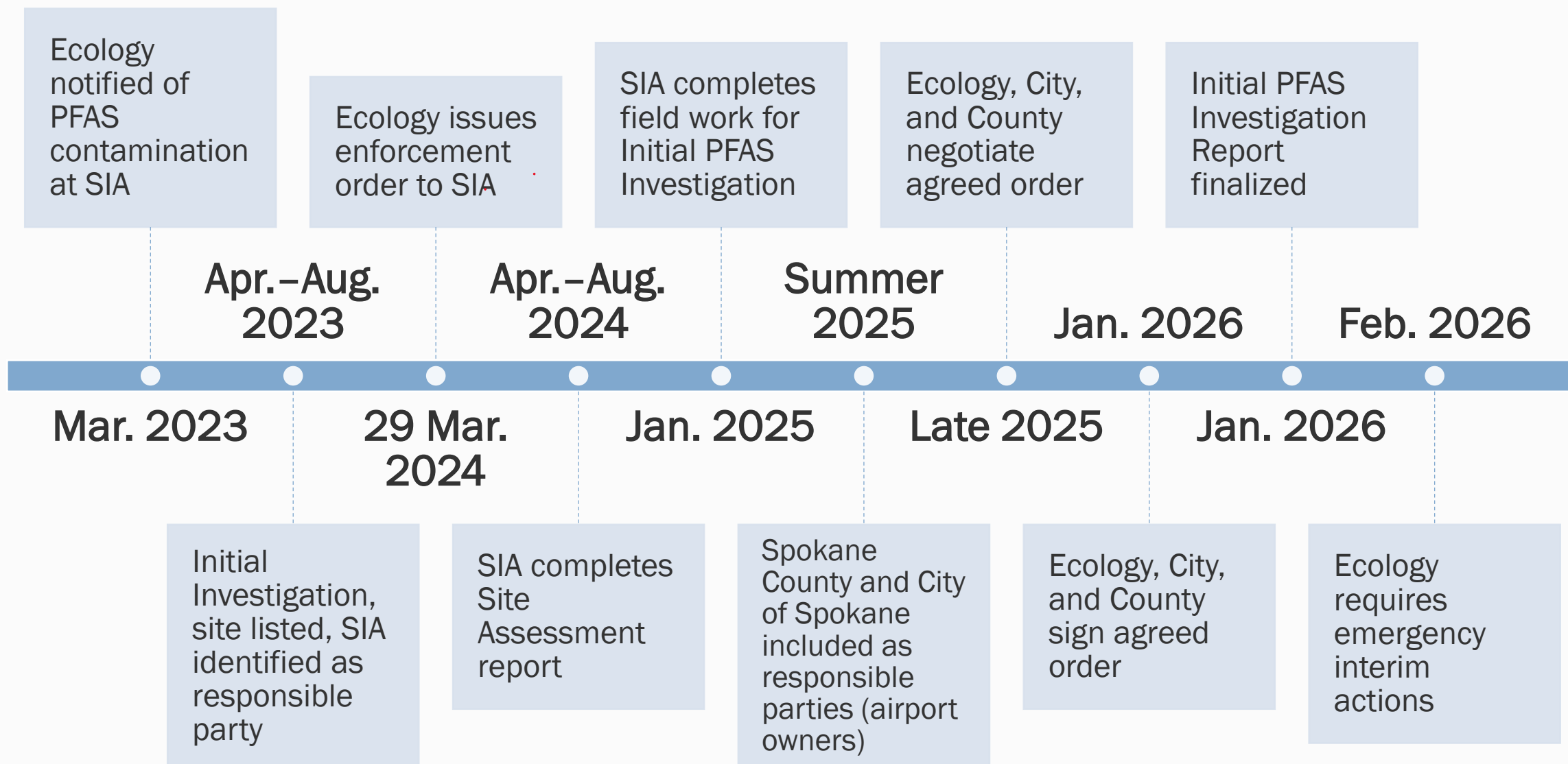

Spokane International Airport (SIA)



- Jointly owned by Spokane County & City of Spokane
 - Airport Board
- Federal certification **required** PFAS firefighting foam use and testing
- Formerly Geiger Field (GEG)

Emergency interim actions required

- Formal notice provided February 10, 2026
- Scope of Work tasks
 - Short-term Interim Action Work Plan (STIAWP)
 - Complete work in the STIAWP
 - Long-term Interim Action Work Plan (LTIAWP)
 - Complete work in the LTIAWP
 - Annual interim action performance reports
 - Interim action progress reports

Short-term IA Work Plan

- Revision accepted April 13
- Responsible parties to provide:
 - Filter pitchers
 - Countertop dispensers
 - Food-grade water containers
 - Access to Garden Springs filling station
- Resources available to all in affected area with private wells
 - no well test needed

Garden Springs water fill station

- 4821 W. Garden Springs Rd.
- Obtain account and access information from city prior to use
- Call 3-1-1 or 509-755-2489
 - Weekdays 7 a.m. to 6 p.m.
- City will annually bill each account for water used
 - ~1 cent for 5 gallons

GARDEN SPRINGS WATER FILL STATION INSTRUCTIONS

1

Call (509) 755-2489 Weekdays between 7 a.m. and 6 p.m. to request an account. This helps us track the amount of water is being used for this PFAS response and provide an annual nominal billing amount. **NOTE: Water access does not require a PIN number until further notice. You will be notified in advance when it takes effect.**

Visit the **Garden Springs Fill Station** at 4821 W. Garden Springs Rd. It is at the intersection of Garden Springs Rd. and Abbott Rd.

Locate the fill faucet on the side of the station – it will have a short hose attached to it.

Remove container cap and insert filling hose into container.

Turn faucet on (turn to left) to fill. Turn off (to right) when finished.

Short-term plan: Well testing

- All private wells in affected area eligible for PFAS testing
- Sampling must begin by July 13
 - All sampling must be scheduled by the end of 2026
- Short-term work plan includes one round of well testing
- Future well testing in long-term plan
- Test results submitted to Ecology

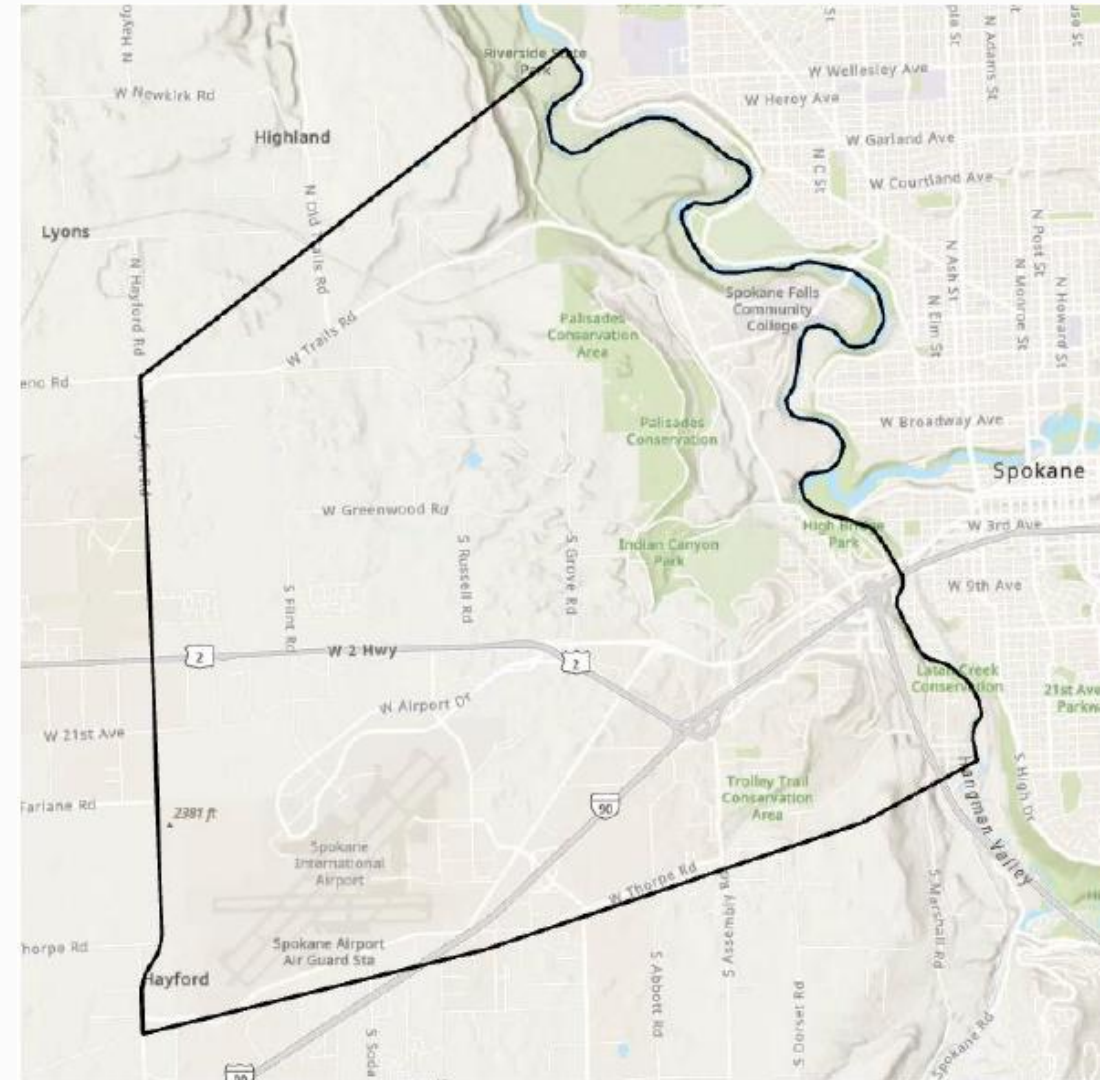


Figure 1. Required areal extent of emergency interim actions

Long-term plan to provide safe water

- Draft long-term plan submitted May 11
- Ecology provided comments June 2, revision due July 2
- 60-day public comment period and meeting when final
- Required scope:
 - Point-of-entry treatment (POET) or connection to city water for contaminated private wells in the affected area
 - Testing for **ALL** private wells in the affected area
 - Every year for wells with PFAS
 - Every 2 years for wells without PFAS
